None so deaf as those who will not hear

My mother is deaf in one ear and partly deaf in the other. So very often when I say something to my mother she will reply with the question: "What?" My father hears perfectly well for an eighty-four-year-old, but he has the bad habit of always saying "What?" to any question no mat-

ter what you say and no matter if he hears you or not. You can image how frustrating having a conversation with these two can be. Its like hearing "What?" in stereo. So, sometimes, just out of devilment, and even though I hear what they are saying, I will say, "What?" when they say, "What?" A typical conver-

sation might go something like this:

Lask my mother: "Did you see in the newspaper that story about Frank O'Meara?" She answers "What?" I say to my Dad; "Did you see that story about Frank in the paper." He answers "What?" My mother appears from the kitchen: "What did you say." And Lanswer "What?" And my Dad says: "Your mother is talking to you." And I say: "What?" Then he says (out of habit) "What?" Then I say "What?" and my mother says "What?" So, now we are all saying "What?" in answer to each other's questions and comments. At which point my mother scolds me for mocking the deaf. Let's face it, your parish priest is a brat.

It's no fun being deaf. It's one of those afflictions that people tend to be intolerant of. Of course, when you are deaf from birth it can also mean difficulty speaking. How do you teach someone who is deaf? Hearing is so essential for so much in life. Although life is not impossible without hearing – it is more difficult. Imagine never hearing a bird sing, a dog bark, the sound of thunder, the sea breaking on the shore or crashing against the rocks. Never hearing the sound of music, a baby cry. Imagine never hearing your mother's voice.

In the Gospel today, Jesus restores the hearing of a deaf man: "He makes the deaf hear and the mute speak." It is one of the signs of the arrival of the Messiah. It points to Jesus as the Chosen One. It should tell the people of His day, and the people of today, that they should listen because this man Jesus has something to say and something that is worth hearing. Listen to Him! Being deaf by nature or accident is one thing, but, being deaf by choice is another. To choose

> not to listen to Jesus, now that is true deafness.

The deaf man was also cured of a speech impediment. There is an expectation that when we learn something we also become teachers. We are called to share what we learn. Either by action or by speech. This is an expectation

on the part of Jesus also. "I send you into the world to proclaim the Gospel to all." So, let's ask ourselves: In this world of many voices, most not worth listening to, do I have something worthwhile to say? Or am I just another noisy gong, an empty blow hard, who makes a lot of noise, but says nothing worth hearing. Saying something worth hearing is important because of those who are listening – especially our children. Listen to Jesus and proclaim His Gospel – do this and you have something to say, something worth hearing. Do this and you can't go wrong.

New project: You will soon notice that we are doing some work in the "cry room" in church. I have asked the environment committee to make this room more colorful, to freshen it up, and make it imaginative, more joyful and child friendly. They have taken on the challenge. We should see some results soon - I hope!
