Holy Family



There is a famous movie reel and photo shot of General Douglas MacArthur jumping from a boat and walking to the beach through the waves as he "triumphantly" returns to retake the Philippine Is-

lands from the Japanese. The message is clear "the triumphant conqueror returns." We see a similar vision of strength in the painting by the German-American artist Emanuel Leutze of General Washington standing at the bow of a boat as he leads the Continental Army across the Delaware to defeat the Hessians at Trenton. Strength, power, wealth, and status, these are things that the world tells us are important. These are the "values," "virtues," and the traits of people who will get somewhere in life and will be able to help us move up the greasy pole. Put your confidence, the world says, in these things, in these people.

When God sent His Son into the world, He could have chosen any place, people, social situation or family. He could have sent His Son into the family of the Emperor of Rome, the household of the King of Israel, the High King of Ireland, or the Emperor of China or Japan. God could have sent His Son as a grown man, as the general of His army of Angels, as a fierce warrior and King of Heaven. But God didn't do that.

Of all the ways God could have sent His Son into the world He sent Him as a baby, to a couple, who were humble and poor, who lived simply and devoutly, and whose names were Mary and Joseph. God sent His Son into a family just like the families we all know, the type of families we all come from, and the type of families we all have and belong to. God sent

His Son Jesus into a family like yours to parents like you.

Saint Luke tells us that Jesus "grew" in grace and wisdom. This means that Mary and Joseph were His teachers. "Grace" means the ways and life of God and "wisdom" means the knowledge of this world and how to apply it for the sake of goodness, compassion and justice. Wisdom means knowing the value of a thing, not just the price, the truth of a thing and not just its usefulness. Jesus learned these things – He learned them from His parents – because this is what they taught, how they lived, and who they were. Jesus learned by being with them.

God sent His Son to Mary and Joseph because He loved Him, and He know they would love Him. Is there any child we know of who does not come from God? Is there any child we know of who God does not love? There is no child who is not God's child. There is no child He loves less than He loved His Son Jesus. For all children are sons and daughters of God. God does for them what He did for His own Son. God still sends His children into families. He asks us to do for them what He asked Mary and Joseph to do for Jesus. He asks us to teach them, raise them, care for them, provide for them, as Joseph and Mary raised Jesus.

If God sent His children to you, well then God must believe that you have the potential to be the best father, the best mother, for this particular child. He didn't send your child to someone else. God sent His child to you. That means God has confidence in you. No one can be the parent, the mother, father, that you can be. God believes in you – don't be afraid to believe in yourself. It's never too late to be the parent God knows you can be, and our children need you to be that father or mother. Every family is called to be a Holy Family.



Happening at OLV

Bless this House 20 + C + M + B + 19

Have you ever seen the inscription 20+C+M+B+19 written in chalk over the entrance to Churches and homes? It is an ancient tradition in the Church to ask for the blessing if the Magi on the Feast of the Epiphany (6^{th} January) and for the coming year. The ritual is simple: take chalk and write: 20+C+M+B+19 above/near the entrance of your home.



The letters have two meanings. First, they represent the initials of the names of the Magi — Caspar, Malchior, and Balthazar — who followed the star to Bethlehem to honor Jesus. However, they also stand for the abbreviated Latin phrase, *Christus mansionem benedicat*: "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the cross, and the "20" at the beginning and the "19" at the end mark the year.

All you need to do is write the inscription and ask God to bless and protect your home and family. You can add any other intention you want. Also, sometimes it is not possible to write above the entrance to the home so anywhere around the door will do. Fr. Ben adds two crosses: +20+C+M+B+19+ (cross at beginning and end – the Irish, what are you going to do!).






