

All Life Matters



In Washington, D.C. this coming week, hundreds of thousands of people will gather for the March for Life. We can't all be there with them, but we can all join with them in prayer and in spirit. We can all support the movement, the movement for Life, a movement to save the lives of unborn children, a movement to save the very soul of our own beloved nation.

The most fundamental point, however, is that all life matters and a nation that is willing to sacrifice the most venerable of its children is a nation that will eventually sacrifice any of its children. Here I am reproducing my Christmas Day message because i think it is relevant this week also.

We celebrate the birth of a Child – every child

Into our world and into our lives God sent His Son as a baby. This child, man and God, from the moment He was conceived in the womb of His Mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary, is a gift from God to us. As I have gotten older, and hopefully grown in wisdom and maybe a little good sense, I have come to realize that every child is a child of God and a gift from God.

More importantly, it strikes me that no matter how a child comes into the world, no child comes into the world without God making it happen. Only God can give life and so every child's existence is a witness of God's work. God makes life happen. Without God willing it there is no life. Further, no matter how they come into the world a child is a gift from God. In marriage or outside marriage, born to the rich or the poor, the powerful or the powerless, every child of every color, every child from every part of the world, children of all sorts, abilities, gifts, talents, challenges, all of them exist because God gives them life. God creates them, and God sends them as His sons and daughters as His gifts to us – our families, communities, nation, even our world. Every child matters to God and so every child should matter to us.

As Joseph and Mary made their way from Nazareth to Bethlehem there was no one to help them. They had no rooms at the inn. They found a stable and they received the gift of God to the world – a child – Jesus. We could not be there for Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, but we can be there for God's children today. All children matter to God because all children, no matter how they come into the world, are God's children. All children matter to God and so all children matter to us. That's our way, that's who we are, that's what we do. We celebrate the birth of a child – every child.

As we remember that the fight for life is the fight for every child and the fight for the soul of our nation, lets recommit to be a parish, a people, and a generation of life. And let's be practical about it, do something to support our local Right to Life Center.




