# MS. KATHY KANE NAMED FOR NATIONAL AWARD By Mary Mazuk

Principal of Our Lady of Victory School since 2007, Ms. Kathy Kane has earned the Distinguished Principal Award from the National Catholic Educational Association (NCEA). This award is given

each year to one principal in each of the United States' geographic regions. The winners must exemplify a clear philosophy of Catholic education with a commitment to excellence; be respected by students, colleagues, parents, and the community; be a leader in civic, religious, or humanitarian activities; and maintain an orderly, purposeful learning environment. Nominated by school parents, staff members, and the Archdiocesan Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Jim Rigg, Ms. Kane will be presented the award in Orlando at the NCEA 2015 Convention and Expo in April. In his nomination letter, Dr. Rigg stated, "Ms. Kane is a deeply respected principal. She has worked hard to ensure that Victory provides the best religious and academic program possible. She is loved by the students and parents, and treats all people with respect and compassion."

Ms. Kane has been dedicated to teaching and learning excellence from the moment she stepped into the role of teacher. She feels it is important to spend her life making a difference in the lives of children. She began her teaching career at Our Lady of Visitation and served as their Assistant Principal/Director of Teaching and Learning for two years before transition to Our Lady of Victory as Principal. She is also an instructor for the Excellence Initiative, a program at Xavier University's Center for Catholic Education, and has been a Mentor Principal for new Archdioce-san administrators, for which she earned the Livitate Dei Award for outstanding mentorship in 2014. She served on the Vision Steering Committee for the Archdiocese from 2010-2012. Yet for all that she does and has done, when asked about what the award means to her, Ms. Kane stated, "While I'm honored about the recognition, it is really about the school. It's about who we are, and what we do. We have exceptional faculty and staff, and we share leadership, dedication, and a desire to provide the best faith-based education we can." She continued, "We have parents and a parish community who really support the school, so this award is about the community of people we have at Victory."

#### Our deacon candidate

We are very pleased to have parishioner Mark Machuga continue his preparation to serve the Church and the local parish as a



deacon. If all goes well, he will be ordained in April 2016. After that, he will be assigned together with Charley Jenkins to serve at Our Lady of Victory. In the meantime, Mark continues his academic studies and formation at Mt. St. Mary's Seminary in Mt. Washington on weekends. In addition to the classwork, the deacons have practical hands-on training in administering the sacraments and some required projects to assist in the good works

of the Church. For one of his projects, Mark coordinated the implementation of the Christ Renews His Parish spiritual renewal weekends.

Recently, Mark took another major step toward his diaconal ordination as he was instituted to the ministry of acolyte in the Church by Covington, Ky., Bishop Roger Foys on February 1st. This rank means that he is given the right and privilege to assist any priest or deacon at the altar at Mass, to **distribute** Holy Communion when a priest or deacon can not, and to serve in making Eucharistic adoration possible to the people. An addi-

tional duty of an acolyte is to assist, instruct, and train altar servers. This is one step beyond extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion (EMHCs) who have a single function: to distribute Communion as delegated by the pastor within their own parish, if there are not enough priests, deacons or acolytes and if the Mass would be unduly prolonged without them.

Once he is a deacon, Mark will have two primary responsibilities in the parish: first, to help with the distribution of Communion to the sick and the homebound, and second to assist the priest (or bishop) at the altar at Mass directly as he stands at his side.

Please pray for Mark and his wife Julie as he prepares to give generously to the Church, conformed to Christ the Servant.

#### Session #1: The Journey of Faith: Trinity, Faith and the God Who Is Love

Symbolon is a unique sounding word that has a deep powerful meaning. When you hear the word symbolon, the first word you may think of is symbol. A symbol is an object that represents or stands for an idea, belief, or action etc. A symbol can take the form of words, sounds, gestures, or visual images and are used to convey ideas and beliefs. In the early Church, Christians described their Creed, their summary statement of faith, as the symbolon, the "seal" or "symbol of the faith." This is the same faith as professed by Jesus Christ. Our faith is our response to the God who created us out of a generous act of love. He longs to have a personal relationship with us, and is constantly seeking us out and revealing Himself to us so that we may have a share in His Life.

One of the core beliefs of our faith is that of the Trinity. Our God is the one true God. We should have fidelity to Him. Jesus Christ is God's word made flesh. The Holy Spirit is the bond of love between Father and Son. Our faith can be expressed through both intellect-knowing and learning about God, and will-living out our faith in our lives. It is best when both aspects are present at the same time. One way to live out our faith is through prayer. Jesus taught us the three elements of prayer-praise, asking for our needs to be met, and saying we are sorry for our sins through the Our Father. Prayer also allows us to have a conversation with God, which is a crucial aspect in developing and maintaining a relationship with Him. Just as you can strengthen your marriage by talking to each regularly, you can also strengthen your relationship with God by talking to Him regularly in prayer. **Why not try it?**

### Eagle Scout - Evan Morgan Becca Sontag



Evan Morgan recently joined an elite group of individuals as he was promoted to the rank of Eagle Scout. Evan, a lifelong parish member and graduate of Victory and Elder, entered the Scouts with a brief stint as a Cub before moving on to the Boy Scouts proper in 7th grade. It was here that he met Mr. Tom Zimmerman and later Mr. Greg Lundy who would provide the guidance and exper-

tise necessary for the challenges ahead.

Evan's love of the outdoors and personal interest in developing his leadership skills while serving his community made him an excellent fit for Scouting which fosters and nurtures all of these traits. Through his experiences, he was able to volunteer locally, help lead younger Scouts through their own journeys, and develop and test qualities of his own character preparing him for the challenges of adulthood that undoubtedly shall arise.

As a mere freshman in high school, he and his pack went on a week long camping trip to a virtually deserted island in Florida where they survived on packed rations, a specialized skill-set, and teamwork as yet another opportunity for Evan and his fellow pack-mates to prove to themselves what they are capable of. He was also given the opportunity to act as Senior Patrol Leader where he was able to share his knowledge, expertise, and leadership skills with younger Scouts.

After rising through the ranks, earning badges through service work and learning new skills, the culmination of Evan's perseverance and dedication was in sight. Only around 5% of Boy Scouts go on to become Eagle Scouts and this must be completed by the age of 18. After taking a two year break from Scouting to focus on the academic demands of high school, being a member of the Elder wrestling team, and an after school job, Evan was ready to crown his time in Scouts with the rank of Eagle just before his 18th birthday.

With all of the other requirements met, there was but one remaining obstacle to conquer before he reached that goal. In order to be promoted in rank, Evan needed to complete a project that would both exhibit and test the qualities that Scouting had developed and matured in Evan in addition to benefitting the community as a whole.

In cooperation with the Western Wildlife Corridor organization and guidance from his mentor, Mr. Lundy, Evan organized the construction of a hiking path. This required the very labor intensive activities of clearing honey suckle and other plant growth along with placing stones to make for easier walking. Not only did Evan have to do this work himself, but had to manage the efforts of others to turn this from a plan into a reality. And all of this had to be completed before Evan's 18th birthday while still having to maintain the other commitments in his life. It was a true test.

It was, however, a test that Evan was prepared for. He overcame each challenge as it arose and with guidance and wisdom from Mr. Lundy and the support of his family, Evan completed this difficult task that many will benefit from. This hiking trail will provide enjoyment to the community, this is sure.

And Evan will carry the skills, lessons, and love of Scouting developed through the years with him for the rest of his life.
