

As we arrive at the near end (or possibly full completion by the time you're reading this) of our Church Nave Renovations, there is much to be thankful for and many to thank. But our mission was never to replace the 1960 renovation of OLV. We understood the importance and personality of the church we've embellished on, but we also knew there was something missing.


