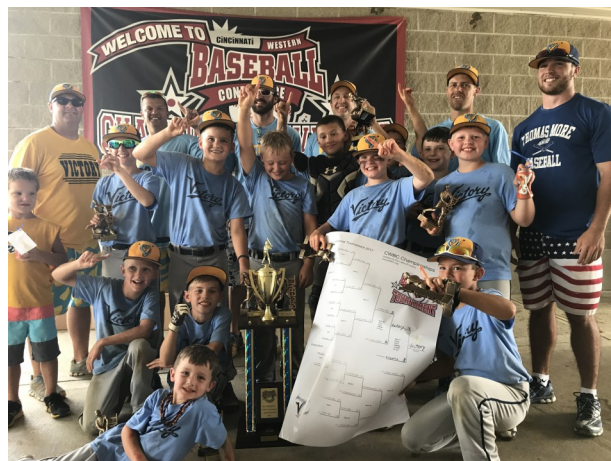
AROUND THE HORN

The 2017 baseball season is now officially over. OLV had over 170 kids play baseball this year across 15 teams from 15u all the way down to tee ball. The kids worked hard and developed their skills throughout the year. The players also helped raised funds for the baseball program by participating in the Kid Glove Game Program with the Cincinnati Reds. The baseball and softball players came together and sold enough tickets to raise \$3,500.00, which will be used for new equipment.

Our Lady of Victory overall was one of the best represented organizations in the league with several teams near the top of the regular season standings and 5 teams winning games in the tournament. This year was a huge success with two teams making it to the finals. OLV was 11 – 7 overall in the CWBC tournament with one runner-up (Davis 11U National – see picture) and one champion (Lammers 9u National – see picture).

Our Lady of Victory was the host to the inaugural CWBC tournament on Saturday June 24th, 2017. After a torrential downpour on the Friday before the tournament, the OLV parishioners worked as a team to ensure the grounds and fields were ready for the kids. The tournament went off without a hitch and fans across the league were complimentary of our ability to host the tournament. Great Job, Our Lady of Victory!

175 YEARS OF MAKING A DIFFERENCE

The OLV Peace & Justice Commission has been celebrating our 175th Anniversary by helping you make a difference in the lives of others.

We began the year delivering over 300 Christmas cards to our military and our annual Christmas Giving Tree. Both events were grand successes thanks to all of you. We continued with a drive for St. Francis-St Joseph Catholic Worker House. Appreciation to all of you who enabled us to deliver to this deserving organization almost 200 pairs of socks, nearly 100 briefs, and 44 t-shirts! Talk about making a difference!!!

Our Rice Bowl collection for Catholic Relief Services allowed us to send them a check for \$687.58. Our OLV Food Pantry continues to help folks in need weekly and with special distributions at Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Easter. Meals continue to be delivered to Tender Mercies twice a month. Most recently, over 130 handbags filled with hygiene supplies were divided between Tender Mercies, Bethany House, and Mary Magdalene House. All thanks to your generous donations.

This summer we will continue our journey to make a difference!!

Our 2nd annual Little Dresses Campaign is now underway. With your help, we can continue to send these beautiful dresses to girls around the world. Check out the website www.LittleDressesforAfrica.com. Here are the details of what is needed:

1) **Folks who can help us sew.** If you have a sewing machine and can sew even one dress let us know. Each dress takes around an hour. You can be as creative or basic as your talents allow. We can match you with donated supplies or you can use your own.

2) **Supplies:** We need **new pillowcases, any size, bright,**

colorful, patterns, think a pretty little dress! Many of our sewers prefer fabric. If you have appropriate remnants at home or see any at the store that would be perfect. Ribbon to adorn these dresses, 1/2" double bias tape and 1/4" elastic help greatly. We have a blue basket in the atrium near the Care Barrels for your donations.

3) **Cash donations** will also help us both purchase supplies, and be collected and sent as a donation to the Little Dresses for Africa organization. This donation will be sent with our dresses to help defray the cost of delivering these treasured dresses to their final destination. If you wish to donate, just place cash, or check made out to OLV, in the OLV collection basket in an envelope labeled Little Dresses for Africa.

Watch for the tree to go up the end of July and details in the bulletin!

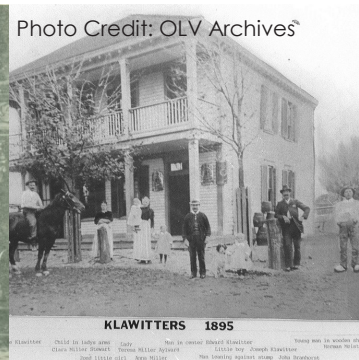
Finally, in September, keep an eye out for our final Anniversary event. We will close the year with a collection for Matthew 25.

More Early Victory Parishioners

Some families have their roots in Delhi going back for many generations. Here are some of the earliest families to be members of Our Lady of Victory.

John Paff (1817-1872) joined the parish in 1857. John and his wife Elizabeth Keene (1824-1905), were married at St. Joseph's Church by Rev. Stehle and had 4 children. His son, Lawrence, married Margaret Emge, granddaughter of Adam Emge. Lawrence and Margaret had 6 children. All four of them are buried in the OLV cemetery.

Joseph Engler (1817-1872) joined the parish in 1857. Joseph and his wife Agatha Gerteison were married at Holy Trinity in 1840. Joseph and his 5 children lived on a farm adjacent to OLV on Neeb Road. Joseph was on the committee in charge of the

cemetery in 1871. Mrs. Agatha Engler donated a statue of the Sorrowful Mother to the 1853 church. It was blessed on September 22, 1889 by Archbishop Elder. It was the only statue transferred to the 1908 church.

Philip Feist (1834-1909) joined the parish in 1859. He married Caroline Bosch (1835-1904) that same year at OLV. They had 11 children and lived on a farm on Rapid Run. Philip Feist served on the building committee for the 1908 church.

Michael Wolfer (1820-1889) joined the parish in 1863. He was married to Barbara Oehler in 1846 by Rev. Huber. They had 7 children. After being a butcher in Germany, he turned to farming in Delhi. William Wolfer was on the building committee for the 1899 rectory and the 1917 convent.

John Reimerink (1828-1893) joined the parish in 1873. John his wife Marie (1834-1892) settled on a farm on Cleves Warsaw Pike east of Van Blaricum Road. They had 6 children and are buried in the OLV cemetery.

Edward Klawitter (1844-1910) joined the parish sometime after 1879. He and his wife Catherine bought the store across the street from the church on Neeb Road in 1895. They added a 2 bowling lanes and a beer garden, making it a popular spot to gather. Klawitter's "General Merchandising Store" remained until 1971. Ed and Kate had 5 children. Joseph Klawitter served as the holy water bearer on Oct. 23, 1908 for the blessing of the ball and cross on the 1908 church. Florian Klawitter served as acolyte for the same ceremony.

SOCIETY OF ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

Dear Our Lady of Victory Parishioners,

Thank you for your generous support of the Society of St. Vincent DePaul. I would like to tell you some of the stories of those we have helped during our recent home visits to struggling families in the Delhi and Saylor Park area.

We visited a mother with 3 teenage daughters who had to leave her husband due to domestic violence in her home. She explained that they left suddenly and were not able to bring anything with them except the clothes they were wearing and a hastily packed bag. She did get some help from her family but needed some additional assistance. We were able to help her get a couple of beds so they did not have to sleep on the floor and assisted her with part of her rent.

We visited a mother who had made some poor choices in her life. She was trying to rebuild her life and create a good family environment so she could get custody of her children and get them out of foster care. We were able to assist her with some furniture and helped pay part of her utility bill.

We visited an older man who owned his own house. He could not afford home owners insurance on his fixed income. He had a fire where his electrical service came into the house. He was lucky and was able to get the fire out but not before it damaged the electrical service and smoked up the interior of the house. His neighbors helped him get the electric service fixed to the house. We were able to assist with some furniture and bed to replace the smoke damaged items. We also helped him pay to get his electric service turned back on in the house.

We visited a grandmother who owns her house and has some of her teenage grandchildren living with her. She works part-time and gets her social security retirement benefits. She became ill and could not work. She was unable to pay her mortgage. We assisted her by paying a part of her mortgage so she did not fall too far behind.

These are the stories of our neighbors living right in our neighborhood. If you would like to be the face of our church and a source of love, hope and mercy for your neighbors, please contact us at the parish office and press the button for the Society of St. Vincent DePaul. When you leave a message we will call you back to discuss how you can become involved in this great ministry of our church. If you cannot become personally involved but would like to help us help others you can make a donation to the Society of St. Vincent DePaul by putting your check in the poor box in the back of church or mailing your check to the parish office and marking on it for the Society of St. Vincent DePaul. Please know that the people we help do appreciate your generosity which allows us to help them through the difficult times they are experiencing.
