About Fr. Ben Cameron:

Fr. Ben Cameron was born in Kokomo, Indiana, and grew up as a member of St. Patrick Catholic Church in that city. During his junior high and high school years, he attended a small Christian school that was operated by a local Baptist church. It was in that non-Catholic environment, where his faith was often challenged, that he began to study the Catholic Faith. Fr. Ben is a 1991 graduate of Christendom College, a small Catholic liberal arts college in Front Royal, Virginia, where he became involved in a lay apostolate known as the Legion of Mary, which awakened his desire to share his Catholic Faith with others. Upon receiving his degree in Political Science and History, Fr. Ben planned a career in the political arena, but soon found that God had other plans. He joined the Fathers of Mercy in 1992, studied theology at Holy Apostles Seminary in Cromwell, Connecticut, and was ordained to the Holy Priesthood on May 31, 1997. Fr. Ben has served as Vocation Director, Treasurer, and parish mission preacher during his priesthood. He currently serves as the Director of the Mission Band.

Survey Intention, Results and Use John Roebel & Parish Council

Last September, Father Reutter and the nine members of Parish Council elected by you to be your representatives, established “Areas of Focus” for this year that all Commissions are using as a basis for their activities. These areas are: Increase Mass Attendance; Increase Parish Census; Increase Parish Revenue; Increase School Enrollment; Increase Involvement or Participation; Build the Faith Community; Increase School & Parish Awareness and Publicity; and Increase Commission Communication. These areas were developed by keeping our overall focus on the Parish Mission which instructs us to use our talents and gifts to bring the Word of the Lord to the world (full statement on website).

We have two unusual circumstances that have been driving much of our activity to support the Areas of Focus. The first is the reality of declining number of priests available to support our Mass schedule. Although this is not a problem for next Sunday, nor next month, there is a real possibility that we could feel this shortage in the next 6 months, year or two years. For instance, other parishes are also dealing with this, as evidenced by O.L. Visitation and O.L. Lourdes recently reducing Mass schedules. With that inevitability, we have decided to make a concrete plan for the day when only one priest will be available for Sunday Masses. In keeping with the guidelines of the Archdiocese, this will result in a Mass schedule of one on Saturday and two on Sunday. Our approach is to do our homework and have this new Mass schedule ready to go when the situation occurs. At this point it is not our intention to change to a new Mass schedule until the situation dictates it. We realize this is an important and sensitive issue to the entire Parish and we are going to give it the thorough investigation it deserves.

The second unusual opportunity is the occasion of the 175th anniversary of our Parish (the 3rd oldest in the Archdiocese and the FIRST on the Westside!). This upcoming monumental event triggered us to ask: 1) How can we celebrate the fantastic impact this Parish has made on our families and our community; and 2) Can we look at ourselves and determine what changes we can make to give ourselves a great start on our next 175 years and achieve our Areas of Focus? This process led to a list of potential projects/initiatives originated by Parish Council and our many Commissions.

Even though our Parish Council and Commission members have extensive knowledge of the Parish, Father Reutter and Parish Council wanted feedback on direction on Mass scheduling and projects associated with the 175th anniversary and Areas of Focus from all in the Parish. To do this, we conducted the parish-wide survey last November. This survey was designed to provide general sentiment on Mass times and projects using “Importance” scale rankings and written com-

ments. We were pleased with the over 300 surveys completed.

Regarding Mass times, no single schedule of times was strongly preferred. The preference seemed to coalesce around an early Mass around 8:30 or 9:00, and a later Mass around 11:00. Many other factors need to be considered in establishing a new schedule, but this input along with written comments will be factored into the recommendation.

The part of the survey dealing with perceived importance of various projects generally confirmed the perception of those on Parish Council. The ratio of “Important” to “Not Important” feedback was:

Along with written comments, this input has been used to create a plan to proceed to the next steps on these projects.

A preschool study is in process and a decision to implement for the Fall 2017 school year will be made in the next few months.

The church interior renovations are being planned and bid as a result of synergies and exceptional cost effectiveness of completion as a total package. We have the funds in hand to complete this work and no debt will be incurred as a result of this work. A Capital Funds reserve will be continued with the rebate from the Archdiocese’ One Faith Capital campaign.

The “Legacy” projects consisting of the Grotto, Playground, Outdoor Classroom, Rosary Walk and Garden are being designed and fundraising plans are being developed. All funds will be raised independent of the Capital program. The plan is to complete these during the 175th Anniversary period.

Again, we thank you for the great input and look forward to the exciting times ahead!

**Finance Commission – March 2016

The Finance Commission recently met to recommend the tuition level for the 2016 – 2017 OLV school year. We do this every January with input from the OLV Business Manager. This is always a difficult meeting as invariably we raise the tuition to cover the projected expenses for the following school year. This year was no exception as the primary driver was the difference between the number of students in the graduating eighth grade class and the incoming first grade class.

Our goal is to maintain the current year tuition rates, but that has not been possible in recent years. This is due to many factors, but a decline in church attendance and a smaller student body have been contributing factors.

Many parishioners at OLV work long hours on the festival and other fund raising activities to raise additional funds for Our Lady of Victory. These activities provide many of the resources that support the school, athletics and other important missions. However, the very simple task of encouraging your friends and neighbors to attend Mass at Our Lady of Victory can also go a long way to build and strengthen our Parish.

We have a team of parishioners led by Peggy Kurz that is studying the feasibility of starting a pre-school at OLV. The proposed start date is the 2017 – 2018 school year. We are approaching this an opportunity to improve the revenue less expenses portion of our budget. A pre-school will certainly provide parishioners (new and current) the opportunity to engage with the OLV School and its excellent teachers, programs and students before the student is in kindergarten.

With your help the Finance Commission will reach our goal of a zero tuition increase school year.

Overcoming Sin Jarred Kohn

Even as a mere seminarian, people have asked me how to overcome sins. I notice that like myself, people get frustrated at our failures to effectively beat sin. It seems like no matter how hard we try or what we do differently, temptation has our number. I have also noted that many people feel like they may be 'spinning their tires' spiritually. That is, feel like they are unable to go deeper in their relationship with the Lord. These two spiritual ailments are often related. I read a blog post recently, that explained St. John Bosco's advice for warding off sin and temptation. It was not an elaborate program to step you through combating the Devil's favorite tricks like; tempting you to eat more dessert, gossip about your co-workers, go to that wicked website, or spending too much time on social media.

St. John Bosco's advice is simpler and in many ways more profound than any step by step program. His advice on how to defeat sin? Get to know the person of Jesus Christ present in the Eucharist. We should always turn to our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament when we are tempted, troubled, angry, or frustrated. He will give us the strength to lead holy lives.

I know for myself, I struggled to understand how to encounter Jesus under the appearance of bread and wine. When I first entered seminary my Eucharistic knowledge and spirituality were lacking. St. John Bosco mentions two important ways the Eucharist helps us to combat our sinful tendencies and follow Christ more closely. The first way is by receiving Holy Communion fervently or well. I was taught growing up that receiving communion was important. I knew in my pea-sized brain that the Eucharist is Jesus' Body and Blood. However, I had no idea on how to prepare myself to receive that unsettling reality.

My suggestions for preparing to better receive Holy Communion.

Look at the readings for Sunday Mass each week before going to Mass. Try to pay attention to the prayers and readings during Mass leading up to Communion. Discerning how God may be speaking to you at Mass. As you approach Holy Communion say a spiritual communion. Which you can look up online or use my version that goes: "My Lord God, I wish to receive You with the purity, humility, and devotion with which Your most holy Mother received You, with the spirit and fervor of the Saints." or another short prayer to better dispose yourself to receive our Lord in the Eucharist.

After you receive Communion thank our Lord for the gift of Jesus' Body and Blood. Then try to just silence your heart and listen to what our Lord may be saying to you. I would also suggest saying a prayer of thanksgiving after Mass (There should be some prayers in the front and back of the Breaking Bread hymnals at Victory.)

The second piece of advice from St. John Bosco was to visit our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament often. This is another way to encounter our Lord and receive more graces to overcome our sins. Take time to visit Jesus in the tabernacle or exposed in adoration outside of Mass. This could be a frequent extended visit to the Church to spend time with Jesus in the Eucharist, anywhere from 15 minutes to an hour. I think it is important to note, that if you are on the parish grounds for any reason between 6am - 9pm., you can just slip into the Church and make a quick spiritual communion (reference my version above) and go back to your business. Simply try to visit the Blessed Sacrament as much as you can.

Receiving Communion well and frequently visiting Our Lord in the Eucharist will help you to overcome sin in your own life. By replacing our attachment to sin with the friendship of Jesus Christ. For it is in Him that we find the source and meaning of our lives.
