CHURCH RENOVATIONS TO BEGIN IN JUNE



Exciting changes to our beloved church, which mostly includes critically needed maintenance, will begin in June. All pews will be removed and refinished at an offsite location. When returned, the center pews will be reconfigured and a beautifully tiled center aisle will be created. The addition of the center aisle includes elements of the architectural drawings intended for the old Our Lady of Victory church in 1908. Our design team has studied these drawings and old photographs to attempt to match certain aspects such as patterns in the flooring and various colors used. Carpeting will also be replaced throughout the nave of the church. But the changes do not stop there. Our choir area will be expanded for a better musical experience and the baptismal font will move to a permanent location under the Holy Family sculpture located near the choir. The move of the font will allow us to create more seasonal displays during May

Crowning, Easter, Christmas and other celebrations.

Mass changes: Due to the renovation, weekend Masses in June will be conducted in the church but we will sit on folding chairs while the pews are removed. Beginning in July and running through early August, we will hold Masses in the Convocation Center. We will re-open the church in early August once the renovation is complete.

As with all renovation projects on an old structure we have thoroughly tested for asbestos before beginning removal of the old tile. We're happy to report that only the glue under the tile contains a small amount of asbestos fibers. This will be easily removed by our licensed contractor and will be completely contained during the three-day removal process.

We are excited for these changes, which are fully supported by our capital budget. No debt will be incurred. Please visit the back of church to see these exciting changes come to life as we have information on display for all to see.



Jim Herman, OLV graduate from the class of 1992, has had a long and difficult path to this point in his professional golf career. At the age of 38, he won his first PGA tournament in Houston, qualifying for a place the next week in the field of the legendary and highly exclusive Masters Tournament in Georgia on April 7.

Sure, we here at OLV are proud of Jim's golf prowess. But we're more proud of how Jim has handled his path to his newfound fame, and his reaction to it. He has endured obstacles on his path to the PGA. The news outlets have documented well over the last couple of weeks Jim's up

and down journey to his first PGA victory. He became a fan favorite immediately with his post-victory television interview, where he humbly apologized for shedding a tear because he was "pretty happy right now."

There are many character-building moments in that tear for Jim. I'll share two that will make you appreciate his achievement a little more. Jim was a good athlete here at OLV. I knew that from my limited observation, but also from discussions I had with his father, John. John and I worked together professionally for 30 years, and we also worked closely on projects here at OLV such as doubling the size of the gym. He confided in me that Jim was devastated when he went to St. Xavier his freshman year and was cut from his favorite team sports. You see, Jim was a late grower and his small build worked against him. Instead of giving up, he tried out for his favorite individual sport (OLV did not have a golf team at the time), making the Golf team. By his senior year, Jim was a member of a state golf champion team and had first team all-state status. This earned him a golf scholarship to UC. A good example for all of us that if you work hard, even though one door closes, another one opens.

The second moment I'll share is tougher. With Jim's victory at Houston and qualification for the Master's the next week, he was afforded some tickets for admittance to the Masters. All golf fans know how difficult it is to obtain these tickets. Jim showed his appreciation to those that he loved and helped him to this point of success in his life. He made them available to the St. X and UC golf teams, his wife's family and to his mother Pam, and brother and sister. But one of his biggest supporters, his father John, could not attend. John has been ill and cannot join in Jim's big moment. (I share this hesitantly, but a local reporter has an article in the paper about it.) John's illness has existed the last couple of years, but Jim, his wife and two children have continued on, even though the situation affects Jim greatly. In the article, Jim said he doesn't talk about John's illness much, since it is tough on him emotionally. He shared, "I miss him tremendously".

I'm sure that Jim's qualities of loyalty, humility, determination, and discipline were instilled by his parents, John and Pam, and were reinforced by his upbringing at OLV and the Westside. Say a prayer for John and root for Jim, a sports pro that can be a role model.
