### THE HOLY FAMILY

The Holy Family is celebrated on the first Sunday after Christmas, but if you think about it, the Holy Family is really celebrated throughout Christmas, individually and as a unit. Why would that be? Well, as I always tell my students, if a particular concept is repeated, that must mean it's important. The more it is repeated, the more important. Our Holy Family, Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, gives us the model to strive for in our families, whether we are part of an "original" family or a "mixed" family as the Holy Family was. The significance of Jesus not being Joseph's blood relation, yet was considered his (Joseph's) son, is so deep, deeper than I can go here, but think about it... Joseph is from the Davidian Bloodline, a Patriarchical royalty of God's own heart. God has adopted us (He adopted Joseph as His earthly father) as part of his lineage while being born of purity in soul and body. God chose us, even with all of our failings. We have also chosen each other in our families and love each other with all of our failings. Let us love each other through this wonderful season of joy and stress.

- Please use Mass of Creation (#193-204 in the Hymnal)
- Continue receiving Communion last, stopping the music when there are about 5 people left in line
- Read and pray about the readings before Mass so that your singing and playing can reflect the readings
- The readings used will be the first set of readings, not the optional readings
- Christmas ends with the Baptism of the Lord on January 12
- You can sing the Christmas Music in the hymnals up through January 12
- If you choose to change the suggested music, please read the readings first and match the music to the readings!
