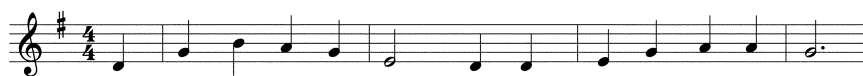

⁴On your right stands the queen in gold of Ophir.

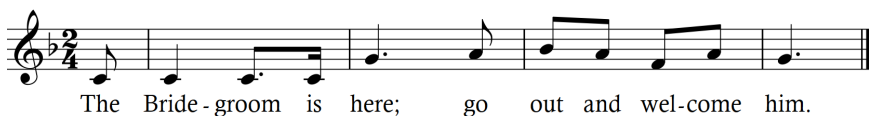

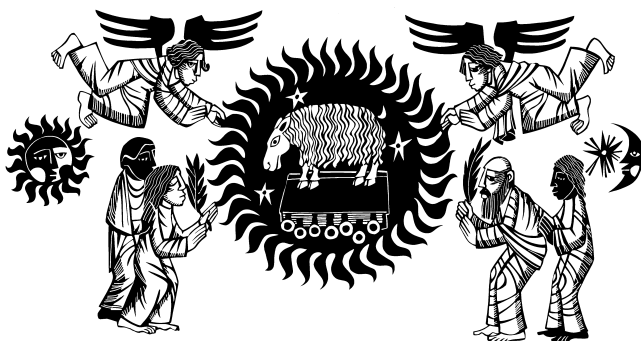


