





Antiphon 1



Psalm 110:1-5, 7 The Messiah, king and priest

Christ's reign will last until all his enemies are made subject to him (1 Corinthians 15:25).

Cantor: The LORD's revelation to my Master: "Sit on my right: your foes I will put beneath your feet."

The LORD will wield from Zion your scepter of power: rule in the midst of all your foes. *Antiphon*

A prince from the day of your birth on the holy mountains; from the womb before the dawn I begot you.

The Lord has sworn an oath he will not change. "You are a priest for ever, a priest like Melchizedek of old." *Antiphon*

The Master standing at your right hand will shatter kings in the day of his great wrath.

He shall drink from the stream by the wayside and therefore he shall lift up his head. *Antiphon*

Lord, you are the Just One, who was and who is (Revelation 16:5).

Women: I will give you glory, O <u>God</u> my King,

⁴I will bless your <u>name</u> forever.

Men: I will bless you day <u>aft</u>er day

and praise your **name** for ever.

The LORD is great, highly to **be** praised,

his greatness can**not** be measured.

Women: Age to age shall pro<u>claim</u> your works,

shall declare your **might**y deeds,

shall speak of your splendor **and** glory, tell the tale of your won**der**ful works.

Men: They will speak of your ter<u>ri</u>ble deeds,

recount your greatness and might.

They will recall your abun<u>dant</u> goodness; age to age shall ring **out** your justice.



Women: The LORD is kind and full <u>of</u> compassion,

slow to anger, abound<u>ing</u> in love. How good is the LORD <u>to</u> all, compassionate to <u>all</u> his creatures.

Men: All your creatures shall thank **you**, O LORD,

and your friends shall re<u>**peat**</u> their blessing. They shall speak of the glory of <u>**your**</u> reign

and declare your might, O God,

Women: to make known to men your <u>might</u>y deeds

and the glorious splendor of your reign.

Yours is an everlast<u>ing</u> kingdom; your rule lasts from <u>age</u> to age.

All: Glory to the Father, and **to** the Son,

and to the **Ho**ly Spirit:

as it was in the beginning, is now,

and will be for ever. Amen.



1 Corinthians 15:25-28

Brothers and sisters,




