The celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation are not intended to bring our formation as Christians to an end, but rather to begin a process of continuing education and formation that is life-long and that gradually unfolds the mystery of God's love and our response as we grow and mature. The Church refers to this life-long process as Mystagogy. All of the Sacraments are generous gifts from our loving God. Mystagogy invites us into a never-ending process of cherishing the gifts of the Sacraments of Initiation & continuously growing in our understanding of the power of God working in us as a result of our initiation into His Church. Understood in this light, Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist are not seen as an end, but rather as a beginning. They are gifts of the Father that strengthen and support us in living faithfully our life in Christ. They are gifts to be continuously meditated upon and studied. Our understanding of them is meant to deepen as we grow and mature.

MASS ATTENDANCE

Every weekend and on Holy Days of Obligation

There is one thing that distinguishes us from other Christians – our devotion to the sacrament of the Eucharist. The Eucharist is the source and summit of our Catholic faith (CCC 1407).

A common complaint from teens (and some adults) is that Mass is boring. But, we, as the St. Helen Sacrament Preparation Team, believe if we truly understood what is happening during the Liturgy, we could never again say that Mass is boring.

God asks of every baptized *child of God* to spend time with Him and the Body of Christ, the Church, on Sunday and other Holy Days of Obligation actively participating in Mass (CCC 2187). This may upset some Catholics, but it is our obligation as Catholics, and therefore an expectation placed on the Disciples candidates. *If a youth in Sacramental preparation is not fulfilling their weekly Mass obligation and on Holy Days of Obligation, why are they preparing for the sacraments of Initiation?* This is not meant to be judgmental. Full, Active, and Conscious Participation in weekly Mass is vital to a youth preparing for Communion & Confirmation. We, the St. Helen Sacrament Preparation Team, do not want to water down or sugar coat our Catholic faith for our teens. We call them in Confirmation to be defenders of the Faith. Why would we not prepare them for battle?

MASS CARDS

To monitor weekly Mass participation, we have created weekly **Mass Cards** [samples below]. These **Mass Cards** may be found in the gathering space just inside the church.


Each week: fill out the youth's information (name, class time, grade, etc) on side 1 of the card. Then, the **Year ONE Youth** writes the answer to this week's question which is located on Side 2 of the **Mass Card**. During the offertory, the **Year ONE youth** places the completed **Mass Card** in the basket.

If, as an Year ONE youth, you attend a weekly Mass at another Catholic Church with your family **other than St. Helen**, please pickup that Parish's weekly bulletin/song sheet, write the full name of the youth and turn it in to **Deepa Duran** at your next **Sacrament Class or LIFE TEEN** event.

If it seems that a parent/guardian is completing the **Mass Card**, the question answer[s] are wrong or the **Year ONE youth** is consistently missing weekly Mass, the Youth Minister, Deepa Duran, will schedule a family meeting—parent[s] and youth—to discuss whether the youth should continue in the **Year ONE** program or postpone the reception of their sacraments.

"Confirmed people are drawn into deeper participation in the life of the Church. They have a desire to be active in their own parish's ministries. They are not afraid to be identified as a member of the Church when they participate in community activities. They look forward to Sunday Mass, to celebrate the Lord's Supper with their brothers and sisters in Christ."

BAPTISMAL / BIRTH CERTIFICATE

If you have not turned in your child's <u>Baptismal / Birth Certificate</u>, a copy is due BEFORE the Tuesday Sacrament Prep class on November 14, 2023.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance will be taken at all **Sacrament Preparation**, **Year ONE** activities (Tuesday Sacrament Prep class, Sunday Life Teen LIFE NIGHTS, etc). Partial attendance is regarded as non-attendance. Please make sure your **Youth** arrives <u>on time</u> and stays through <u>to the end</u> of the **Sunday Life Teen LIFE NIGHTS, Tuesday Sacrament Prep class, Retreats, etc**.

It is understood that a parent and/or a sponsor will attend and participate in all of the **Tuesday Sacrament Prep** classes with their child[ren]. Please <u>arrive before</u> **Tuesday Sacrament Prep** class begins, so you can find your seat, get all of your materials, and get settled. **Tuesday Sacrament Prep** class will not begin until all families are present or accounted for.

TUESDAY SACRAMENT PREP CLASS

It is understood that a parent and/or a sponsor will attend all **Tuesday Sacrament Prep** classes with their child[ren].

and LIFE TEEN

As a Eucharist-centered movement within the Roman Catholic Church, **LIFE TEEN** leads high school youth and their families into a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ and His Church. With the Blessed Virgin Mary as our intercessor and guide, **LIFE TEEN** seeks to unleash the fullness of the Sacramental power present within the young Church.

Because of our deep Eucharistic devotion, **LIFE TEEN** has developed a spirituality that is: 100% Catholic, Obedient to the Magisterium, Centered on the Eucharist, Scriptural, Liturgical, Catechetical, Sacramental, Focused on social justice, and Comprehensive.

SUNDAY LIFE TEEN LIFE NIGHTS begin at 5:30 pm on Sunday and ends at 7:30 pm. We meet for the Life Teen LIFE NIGHTS in the Teen Center.

Sunday Life Teen LIFE NIGHTS are all year long. **Sacrament Prep youth** attend **SIX** specific LIFE NIGHTS (referred to as AD LIFE NIGHTS) during their **YEAR ONE** year. These **Sunday AD LIFE Nights** supplement their **Tuesday Sacrament Prep** classes and also help to foster community among their peers.

The term "AD" refers to the particular Sunday Life Teen LIFE NIGHT that <u>all</u> **Sacrament Prep youth** are required to attend and participate in. The 2023-2024 LIFE TEEN Calendar is on **pages 13-14** of this booklet.

GRACE CARDS

We recognize that there are times when family or an emergency can prevent an YEAR ONE from attending a scheduled activity. Therefore, each Sacrament Prep YEAR ONE youth will be given 3 Grace Cards* for their Sacrament Prep YEAR ONE year. On the Sacrament Prep, YEAR ONE Youth's <u>4th</u> absence, the Youth Minister, Deepa Duran, will schedule a family meeting—parent[s] and youth—to discuss whether the youth should continue in the YEAR ONE sacrament preparation program or postpone the reception of their sacraments.

*Grace Cards may only be used for **Tuesday Sacrament Prep YEAR ONE classes** OR **AD LIFE TEEN LIFE NIGHTS.** Grace Cards MAY NOT BE USED for the retreat requirement.

RETREAT

One of the components of the **Sacrament Prep**, **YEAR ONE** program is participating & attending an approved retreat. As a LIFE TEEN **Sacrament Prep**, **YEAR ONE** youth, we have a NET retreat on **Thursday**, **October 5** from **4:45-8:45 pm** at **St. Helen**.

Your Sacrament Prep, YEAR ONE fees have paid for the October 5th retreat.

You are free to choose another retreat offered by another parish. *However, it will need to be preapproved by Deepa Duran, your St. Helen Youth Minister*. And, you will need to pay all the fees associated with the other parish's retreat.

CHOOSING A GODPARENT / SPONSOR

Hopefully you've thought a lot about what receiving the sacraments of initiation mean, and how the Holy Spirit will affect your life. You're required to have a godparent/sponsor—someone who guides you and shares the story of faith with you now and throughout your life.

SOME ADVICE TO THE YOUTH: You're looking for someone you trust, whose faith you admire and who will be there for you to help you grow in your Catholic faith as you continue to grow older.

SERVING AS A GODPARENT/SPONSOR COMES WITH GREAT RESPONSIBILITIES:

A godparent/sponsor <u>must be a Roman Catholic</u> because Godparents officially represent the Catholic Church by witnessing what it means to live a *baptized* life, *confirmed* in the Holy Spirit and faithfully participating in the sacraments of *Reconciliation* and the *Eucharist*, the source and summit of the Christian life.

GODPARENTS/SPONSORS TRUTHFULLY STATE ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:

- 8 I am at least 16 years of age.
- 8 I am a registered member of my parish.
- 8 I am an active member at my parish. [financial support and involvement in ministries]
- 8 I have received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion and can show proof.
- 8 Relationship status*:
 - 8 I am married, and I married within the Catholic Church and can show proof.
 - or
 - 8 I am unmarried, nor am I cohabitating with my significant other [living together under the same roof: part-time, full-time, or occasional sleepovers].
- 8 I am committed to my Catholic faith.
- 8 I attend and participate in weekly Sunday Mass.
- 8 I receive God's mercy in Confession regularly and the Eucharist as often as possible.
- 8 I witness to the teachings of the Catholic Church by the way I life my life as a disciple of Jesus Christ.

RELATIONSHIP STATUS NOTES:

- Those Catholics in second+ marriages must have had their previous marriage[s] annulled and their second+ marriage convalidated by the Catholic Church.
- Those Catholics presently in civil or common law marriages are not eligible to serve as a godparent or Confirmation sponsor.
- A godparent who is unmarried, must be living a life consistent with the single vocation as defined by the Catholic Church.
- Any single person cohabitating with another person, living in a romantic relationship or as a couple, is ineligible to minister as a godparent or Confirmation sponsor.

A GODPARENT/SPONSOR 'IN GOOD STANDING'?

Being a faithful 'Catholic in Good Standing' means we have a moral and spiritual obligation to follow and give our full agreement to the teachings and norms of the Roman Catholic Church. As Catholic Christians, we believe that our faith and works save us; because of the salvific work promised us by Jesus Christ. Founded in and intertwined with God's Ten Commandments, this is why we

- 8 fully and actively participate in the Liturgy of the Mass on Sundays;
- elebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation regularly [every 1-2 months];
- 8 Tithe 3-10% to our parish weekly;
- 8 develop and maintain a personal relationship with God through daily prayer;
- and participate in the catechetical, sacramental, and communal life of our parish.

If you are living out your Catholic faith as a as a "CAFETERIA CATHOLIC" — someone who picks and chooses Church teachings according to what they want to believe or not believe — you may not exercise the ministry as a Baptism godparent or a Confirmation sponsor.

A few examples of a person living as a Cafeteria Catholic:

- 8 Supports the pro-choice movement [abortion and contraception]
- 8 Supports re-defining marriage
- 8 Is "living with" [cohabitating] someone else or only civilly married;
 - 8 while engaging in intimate sexual relations (outside the Sacrament of Matrimony)
- 8 Is attending Mass only when they feel like it or it fits into their schedule.
- 8 Does not regularly receive God's mercy in Confession

If we do not understand the faith – we are called to take the time to be informed about it; participate in the religious education opportunities of our parish; and/or meet with a parish priest. Learn what it is that we believe, why we believe it, how do we live out our faith. We can also pray for the courage and perseverance, not only to live out the faith, but to proclaim it to a world that so desperately needs to hear the truth of God's message, now more than ever! May God continue to bless you in your faith journey and good works, as we collectively evangelize the Good News of Jesus Christ!

GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORM DETAILS

It is up to the **YEAR ONE** youth to give their sponsor a **St. Helen Godparent/Sponsor Eligibility Form** to fill out and return to St. Helen (address: 5510 W. Cholla St, Glendale, AZ 85304 or fax: 623-412-1226 or email: dduran@sthelenglendale.org) This needs to be turned/mailed in **before the Tuesday Sacrament Prep class on November 14, 2023.** (forms can be found in the FORMS section of this booklet or online — <u>https://www.sthelenglendale.org/YM-SacPrep</u>. If you need extra forms, contact the Youth & Young Adult Coordinator, Deepa Duran.

In order for the **Godparent/Sponsor Eligibility** form to be considered **COMPLETE**, the following must be met:

- 1. Fill out the form completely.
- 2. **Obtain** the parish seal/signature from the Godparent's/Sponsor's parish [it is a raised embossment or decal]
- 3. **Submit** necessary sacrament documentation to dduran@sthelenglendale.org


If you are unsure If the person you have chosen as your godparent/sponsor, please ask your Youth Minister, Deepa Duran.

Remember, your sponsor should be someone whose **Catholic faith you admire and want to strive after their example of holiness because he/she <u>is active</u> in their parish church and <u>can share</u>







Recreate me to be the person You destined me to be. Please use me as an instrument in Your merciful hands to rescue others and to help recreate this world that You so love. Amen.

PREPARING OUR HEART FOR CONFESSION

(Adapted from the Hallow App [Teens])

Confession might seem a little intimidating. It's human nature to want to avoid thinking about the mistakes you have made, especially if your mistakes have usually gotten you in trouble with parents or teachers. The sacrament of Reconciliation isn't about getting you in trouble, though. God is not waiting in confession to give you a detention or scold you for your sins. He is waiting to welcome you with open arms. To help you heal from the wounds that sin has left in your life. Think of it like going to the doctor when you are sick. You tell the doctor about your symptoms and the doctor helps you feel well again.

Today, we're going to spend some time thinking about how sin has wounded our relationship with God, our relationship with others, and our relationship with ourselves. We'll start by asking God to help us examine our hearts, and then, we'll think about ways we haven't lived up to who God has made us to be.

Find a comfortable, quiet spot. It may help to close your eyes, or have a journal close by to write in. Let's begin...

+ In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Dear Holy Spirit, come into my heart and prepare my soul for this moment of grace. Grant me the gift of self-knowledge that I may better understand the sins which keep me from You and grant me the courage that I may confess them without fear.

Mother Mary, please stand by me and pray for me that I may receive this gift of mercy from your Son. Amen.

After reading the questions on the next two pages, you can answer them silently in your mind or write down your thoughts in a journal. Remember that the answers to these questions are private. You don't have to share them with anyone except the priest who hears your confession.

FIRST, THINK ABOUT YOUR FRIENDSHIP WITH GOD.

God loves you and knows that your ultimate goodness is only possible when you let Him into your life. Sin that leads us away from God hurts by pulling us away from the love and grace that our soul needs to thrive. Our relationship with God should be the starting point for everything else in our lives. Do you find time to pray each day? Do you go to Mass every Sunday? Do you make space for God within your mind and heart, as well as, in your calendar? When you go to Mass, do you pay attention? If you have questions about your faith, do you seek out the answers? Do your words and actions show the deep love you have for God? When you speak God's name, do you do so with reverence and respect?

We are made to love God and to be loved by Him.

As you prepare for confession today, consider if there are any sins preventing you from accepting God's love and responding to Him wholeheartedly.

Now, THINK ABOUT YOUR FRIENDSHIPS WITH OTHERS.

If we love God, we should also love our brothers and sisters who are made in God's image.

Do your relationships with others reflect the truth that they are beloved by God?

What would it look like to love others the way they deserve to be loved?

Do you speak to others with kindness? Do you stand up for others when you encounter bullying, racism, or injustice?

Ask God to help you examine your heart.

Do you carry any anger or jealousy in your soul that God can help heal? Are there people whom you need to forgive or areas in your life where you need God's grace to be patient or generous towards others?

In your own family, do you help carry the responsibility of making your home a place of love and goodness?

In romantic relationships, do you respect the dignity of the other person? Are you careful to never use other people or their bodies for your own enjoyment?

- Does your use of social media and technology respect the goodness and dignity of your brothers and sisters in Christ?
- Are you honest with others? Do you tell the truth with your words, as well as, with your actions?
- Have you cheated on any tests or taken things that don't belong to you?
- Do you protect life and dignity of other people?
- Do you give of your time, talent, and treasure to help care for the poor and those in need?
- Do you help protect lives that are threatened: the unborn, the elderly, those on death row, those fleeing war or famine? Have you done anything to purposely harm any-one?

FINALLY, THINK ABOUT HOW YOU TREAT YOURSELF.

Don't forget that you are also God's beloved creation. Sin can twist our self-image and cause us to forget how deeply we are loved by God. Ever since the Garden of Eden, the devil has tried to make us doubt our goodness. If you struggle with loving yourself, God wants to tell you as many times as you need to hear it, "you are His beloved cherished creation!"

Do you love yourself as God loves you?

If you struggle to love yourself and treat yourself with kindness, confession can be an opportunity to invite God to remind you of your goodness. And, to help heal any self-hatred you might carry.

Do you care for your body as a gift from God? Do you give your body the things it needs to be healthy: rest, healthy food, loving friendships?

Let's take some time to think through each of these areas one more time. Take note in your mind or on paper with what stands out. That's what you'll want to talk to God about when you go to Reconciliation.

First, you should talk to God about your friendship with Him. Tell Him about anything that is getting in the way of your relationship with Him. Ask for His forgiveness and help to spend more time with Him in prayer or at Mass.

You should also talk to God about your friendships with other people. Who do you struggle to love? What feelings or situations make it hard for you to love others as you should? Ask for His forgiveness and for His grace to see others thru His eyes. And, lastly, you can talk to God about how you treat yourself.

Let God remind you of your goodness

Let God remind you of your goodness.

Remember, Reconciliation is a gift. It's normal to be a little nervous. But, God is waiting with so much joy, ready to take away the burdens you have carried. He loves you so so much. Nothing you tell God about in confession will make Him love you any less. God already knows your sins, and He knows He has the perfect medicine for you. He can't wait to give you all the grace you need to love Him, to love others, and to love yourself.

Let's end our examination with the **ACT OF CONTRITION**, the prayer you will pray at the end of Confession:

My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and in failing to do good, I have sinned against you, whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin.

+ In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE TO CONFESSION

- The Priest will welcome you to the Sacrament of Confession.
- When you are ready to begin, <u>YOU</u> begin with the SIGN OF THE CROSS:
- + In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

 The priest will then say these or similar words: May God, who has enlightened every heart, help you to know your sins and trust in His mercy. [The priest may read a scripture passage at this time.]

• Then, **YOU** say these or similar words:

Don't be afraid to ask the priest for help.

"This is my first confession"

- or "My last confession was _____ (weeks, months, years) ago" THEN
- "My sins are: (tell your sins simply and honestly from your heart)" *THEN*

"For these and all the sins I cannot remember, I am truly sorry."

Listen to the advice the priest gives [helps you grow in grace with God, others, & yourself.]

• The priest will propose a **penance** for you.

[The **penance** takes into account your personal situation and supports your spiritual growth. Your **penance** could be a prayer, an offering, an act of mercy, service, or sacrifice.]

Make sure you understand what your penance is before praying the ACT OF CONTRI-TION.

• The priest will then ask you to pray an **ACT OF CONTRITION:**

My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and in failing to do good, I have sinned against you, whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin.


• The priest, acting in the Person of Christ, prays the PRAYER OF ABSOLUTION over you:

You both Say: "AMEN."

- The priest will pray the Final Blessing.
- You can say: "Thank you, Fr. _____ "

AFTER LEAVING THE CONFESSIONAL, spend some time with God thanking Him for his mercy and forgiveness of your sins. And, then, pray/do your penance.

Your sins are forgiven as soon as you receive the Prayer of Absolution. You pray your Penance to show that conversion has happened in your life; that you desire to be in a relationship with God.
