
It was a beautiful first day of school for the students of St. Joe's.

I can't tell you how many people stopped to tell me what a wonderful parish and community I was joining here at St. Joseph. Those comments only served to raise my excitement level even higher. I am blessed to be able to move to such a wonderful parish and I look forward to getting to know all of you. If you see me any where please stop and say hi I can't wait to meet you all.

A little bit about myself. I was born and raised in Green Bay, Go Pack!. My home parish and grade school was St. Francis Xavier which is also the Cathedral. Eagle Scout Project

Matthew Peura is a current parishioner who attended the Parish School graduating in 2018. He is a Senior at Wauwatosa East High School and a Scout in our Troop 485 working towards Eagle. To accomplish this, he is required to lead a community project and for this project, Matthew decided to help out his St. Joseph Parish community. Here is what Matthew wrote about his project:



"I was excited to have the opportunity to give back to the community that helped build my education and life allowing me to skills be very successful in high school. My Eagle Scout project focused on three areas around the main entrance to the Church on Center Street. The first area included the berm around the St. Joseph Parish sign where I led a team of scouts to scrape off the old paint and then paint on a fresh new coat. We also planted perennials and put several layers of mulch down. The second area included the berm around the bell tower where the team removed weeds. trimmed back the bushes, leveled the soil, and then placed several inches of mulch. The third area included the garden just outside the entrance where weeded the mulched. Planning for this project

started in April and the work was finally completed in July. A total of 72 people hours were contributed to complete the entire project. This work could not have been done without the help and support of all the scouts from Troop 485 who took time out of their weekends and evenings and a special thank you to Matt Adams for providing supplies, tools, and guidance that were needed to see the project to completion."
