Don't Squander the **Gift of Salvation**

We have been given so many gifts and blessings by our Heavenly Father. Yet, in our fallen state it is all too easy to take them for granted. Our readings today teach us that we must live with an intentional awareness of our many blessings and use them gratefully to glorify God.

In our Gospel passage from Matthew, Jesus uses the image of a vineyard to teach the importance of using our blessings well. He tells the story of a landowner who plants a vineyard and leases it to tenants before he goes on a journey. Instead of tending the vineyard, the tenants mistreat the servants in the vineyard and even the son of the landowner, whom they kill. When the landowner realizes what the tenants have done, he puts them to death and leases his vineyard to tenants who "will give him the produce at the proper times."

By Baptism, we have received the gift of salvation and membership in Kingdom of God — we are now "tenants" called to work in the "vineyard" and produce fruit for its owner, our Heavenly Father. Jesus makes it clear that we if we squander the gift of salvation, we will lose it. It is a sobering truth. So, let us use our intellect to think on these gifts throughout the day and resolve to use all our gifts for God's glory.

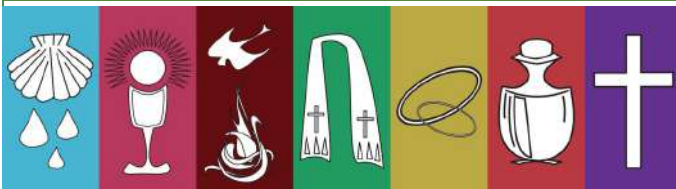

Helping Hands Returns on February 4, 2024

St. Joseph Parish will repeat our success in packing meals for people in poverty in Africa with a Helping Hands event on February 4th of next year from 11:45 to 2:00 p.m. in the School Hall. Helping Hands provides nutrition for children and families in Africa through cooperation with the Rise Against Hunger (RAH) nonprofit organization.

RAH provides dry meal ingredients, packing equipment and shipping boxes. The sponsoring organizations, such as our parish, provide volunteers to measure rice, soy, dried vegetables and vitamins into meal packets, heat seal the packets and pack them into shipping boxes. RAH transports shipping containers of the boxes overseas to its community centers in Africa.

Last year we had more than 130 volunteers pack almost 20,000 meal packages over a two- hour period. We hope to meet or exceed that goal on February 4th.

Parish members, religious education students and day school families are strongly encouraged to participate!

St. Joseph's will again depend on the kindness and donations of parish members to raise much of the money for the event. This year, contributions can be sent directly to a Helping Hands account in the parish office.

Due to increased expenses; however, we will seek sponsors to support the event. We are hoping to connect with local businesses or organizations to serve as event sponsors for a portion of the costs.

Synod on Synodality

Since October 2021, the Church has been engaged in a process of consultation and preparation for the 2021-2024 International Synod of Bishops. The theme for this international synod is, "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission." The Archdiocese of Milwaukee engaged in the consultation process in Spring of 2022, and the synthesis of our local dialogue was submitted in June of 2022.

Bishops and delegates from all over the world are arriving in Rome for the opening session, which begins with Mass on October 4, 2023, and concludes on October 29, 2023.

Every session of the Second Vatican Council began with the prayer *Adsumus Sancte Spiritus*, the first word of the Latin original meaning, "We stand before You, Holy Spirit," which has been historically used at Councils, Synods, and other Church gatherings for hundreds of years, being attributed to Saint Isidore of Seville.

St. Joseph Congregation will pray this simplified version in the coming days and weeks, calling upon the power of the Holy Spirit: for the Synod, for our Holy Father Pope Francis, for bishops throughout the world, for all those who will gather, and that all may be attentive to the Holy Spirit.
