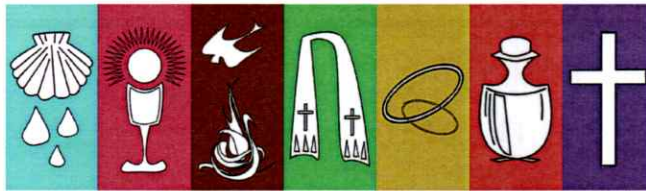

There's Still Time to "Clear the Clutter" In Our Lives

Today we celebrate the Third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday. "Gaudete" is a Latin word, meaning "rejoice." The Christian steward should be characterized by a spirit of rejoicing.

Our First Reading, from Isaiah, expresses a fitting motto for us. "I rejoice heartily in the Lord, in my God is the joy of my soul." It is God Who is the source of our joy and contentment — not things or achievements or comfort, but our relationship with God.

This is why stewards can share so freely of their time, talents and material possessions — because ultimately, we are not attached to these things. We recognize them as good gifts from our loving Father, but we are attached to the Giver of the gifts, not the gifts themselves. This allows for great freedom in life and the capacity for great joy in the Lord.

In fact, we can become like John the Baptist, in today's Gospel passage from the Book of John. We read this description of the prophet: "He came for testimony, to testify to the light... He was not the light but came to testify to the light." This is our calling too — to testify to the Light, our wonderful Savior — by the way we make use of the time, talent and treasure He has entrusted to our care.

When God Himself is the source of our joy, it cannot be taken away from us. There is still time, this Advent season, to clear away any "clutter" in our lives that may take our focus away from Him. Let us strive to detach from any of these things so that we can be free to truly rejoice in God on Christmas Day.

Being Where Jesus Was and Is

How do we prepare for Jesus in this season? The evangelist Luke would appear to give us a particularly good way of doing so, rooted in how Jesus came to us.

It is Luke who tells us that Mary had to travel with Joseph right before her birth from Galilee to Judea to give birth to her child and place him in a manger because there was no room for them in the inn. Luke writes about the angels appearing to the shepherds in the fields at night announcing the birth of Jesus and about the shepherds journeying to see Jesus. It is Luke who tells us that after Jesus was born, Joseph and Mary offered two turtle doves or two young pigeons. "According to the law found in Leviticus 12:6-8, this was the offering for those who could not afford the extra offering of a lamb.

Notice Jesus' solidarity with the poor and needy. He is born in a stable in a manger – a humble condition. It is shepherds who hear the angels sing, 'Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among men with whom he is pleased'! In Luke's gospel, God comes to poor shepherds in the fields at night. Both the holy family and the shepherds were not in a comfortable home when Jesus was born. Jesus was born to a family in humble circumstances, who had to offer for him an offering that the poor could afford. Later, Luke will write about Jesus stressing his coming to help the needy.

This Advent a good way to prepare for Jesus' coming is to help those who were a special focus of Jesus' help.

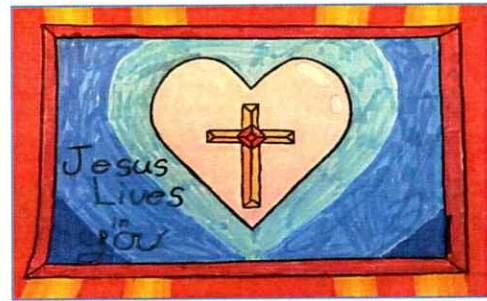

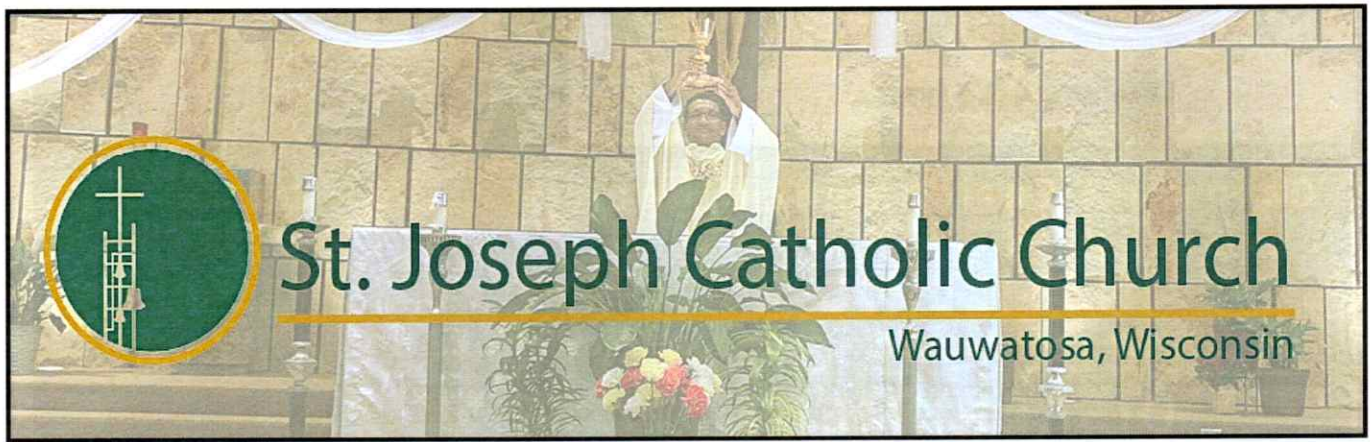
