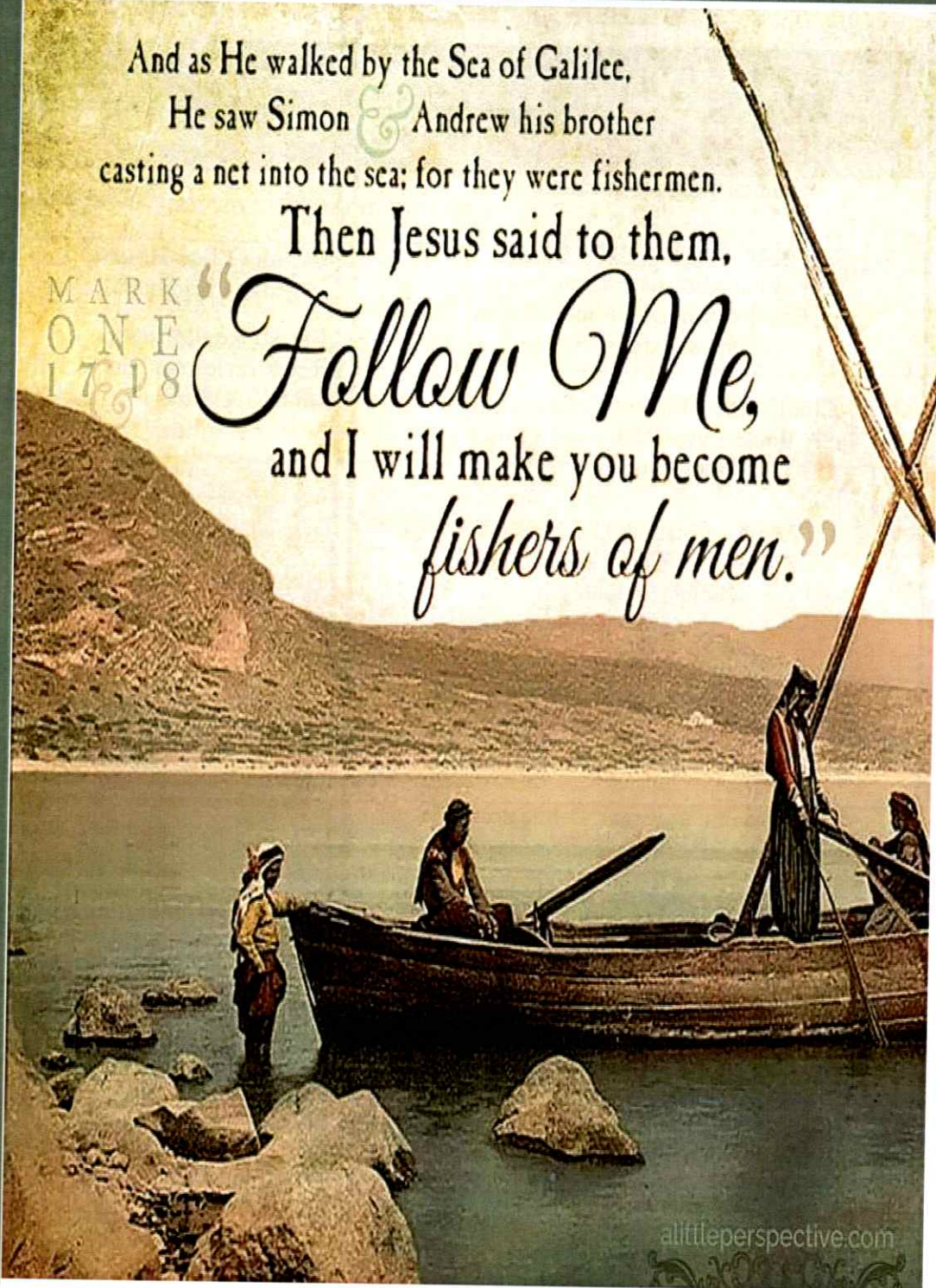

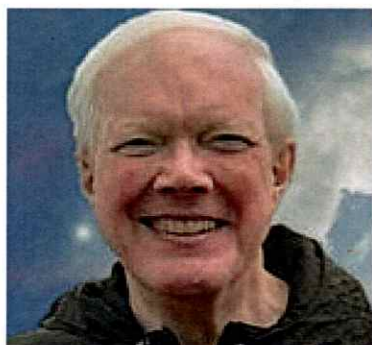

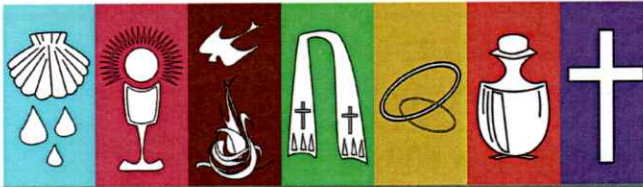


It is with sad hearts that we share the news that our beloved former pastor Fr. Dennis has passed.

Sacraments

Baptism: Parents who wish to have their child baptized must be registered members of St. Joseph Parish and practicing their Catholic Faith. A pre-baptism class must be attended prior to the date of the baptism. Baptisms are celebrated at one of the weekend Masses or at another arranged time. Funerals: Please call the Parish Office in the event of the death of a loved one. Arrangements will be made for planning of the service including the musicians. Advanced planning may be done by making an appointment with Father.

Reconciliation: 3:00 pm-3:45 pm Saturday or by appointment. Please call the Parish Office.

Weddings: Couples must contact the pastor to make arrangements for marriage. No date should be set until this is done as the church may not be available. The Catholic party must be a registered and practicing member of the parish for at least six months prior to setting a date. In addition, a six month period of preparation is required for marriage.

Christ Is Calling Us to Act Now

Today's readings call us to be decisive in our faith.

Simon, Andrew, James, and John demonstrate this decision for us in their response to Christ's calling, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." In both instances, the men immediately abandoned what was before them and followed Christ.

Imagine if Simon and Andrew looked at their Savior and said, "Thanks for the offer, but we will finish up fishing and meet you later." That is no way a disciple should respond to Christ's call. Yet, that is how we often respond to Jesus' offer to us, "Come after me." We can easily fall into the misconception that we have plenty of time to live active discipleship. But as faithful stewards of our time, we must change our ways and immediately follow Christ more intentionally, because Christ is calling us to act now.

These men became members of Jesus' 12 apostles. They surrendered their entire lives to follow Christ. We, too, are called to surrender our lives to the Lord so that He may work through us. We might think, "God isn't calling me." But indeed, He is. Just as He called four ordinary fishermen, He is calling each one of us. Renewing and reevaluating what God might be asking of us throughout our lives is a key component of our stewardship journey.

As we settle into this New Year, let us ponder the ways we can renew our commitment to God. Let us ask ourselves: what are we casting our nets for? And are we willing to leave it behind for something much greater? And if not now, when?

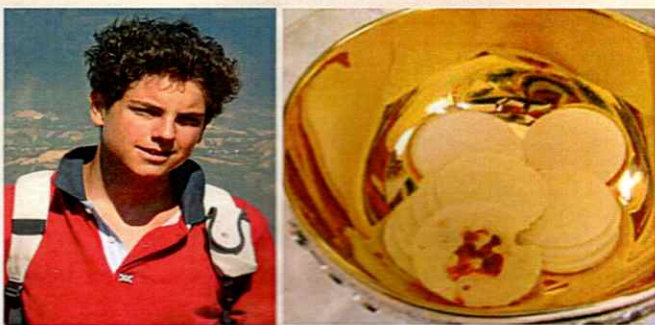

The Parish Council would like to share information of the upcoming pastor changes.

Fr. Adam has been called back to India by his order and will be leaving on March 1st.

The archdiocese's procedure is to appoint someone to be the interim administrator of the parish from March 1st through June 30th, with the understanding that the parish will be assigned a new pastor beginning in July.

This administrator will have all the authority and functions of a pastor. The interim administrator can be a retired priest or a Deacon. If a priest is not assigned as an administrator, the archdiocese will coordinate a "help out" priest to perform Masses and other liturgical functions.

The archdiocese is also beginning the process of assigning a new priest to St. Joseph's. The pastoral council will complete a parish profile, which helps a prospective priest learn more about the atmosphere and 'feel' of our parish to make sure it is a good fit.

Men's Silent, Preached Retreat Updates:

Many men ask me "what do you do and learn on these retreats"?

One of my favorites is the Conferences led by the Director. We have Fr. Mike Graham S.J. a retired President of Xavier University in Cincinnati for our weekend Director. Fr. Mike will present to us his version of the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius, the Founder of the Jesuit order. He will lead us through the 4 "weeks" of the Exercises over our 3 days with him. This involves 8 separate 25-45 minute sessions.

Week #1 is when St. Ignatius proposes considerations to help us realize how much we are loved by God. We can ponder God's loving goodness and the realization that we can do better in our response to this love. Reconciliation is Friday night.

Week #2 invites us to the contemplative method of prayer favored by Ignatius. We hear about the mysteries of the life of Christ to us. Scripture scenes and readings are introduced.

Week #3 is when we focus on the passion and death of Jesus. It is not easy to be with a person who is suffering, but as a close friend or family member, we cannot allow ourselves to be anywhere but by their side.

Week #4 is the final week of the Exercises where we enter into the Joy (Jesus Only You) of Christ. We see Jesus as He shares His resurrection joy with his friends. We are challenged to die to our own individual and communal sinfulness as we hope to rise to a new realization of God's abundant love for us. We contemplate an immersion in the reality of a loving God.

Dates are Thursday Feb. 22nd at 7pm supper through Sunday Feb. 25th, 2024 after 11am Mass and lunch. This experience can bring great insight for us sinners. No extra charge for daily Mass. Rosary and Stations are part of retreat. Meet with a Jesuit in private for discussions.

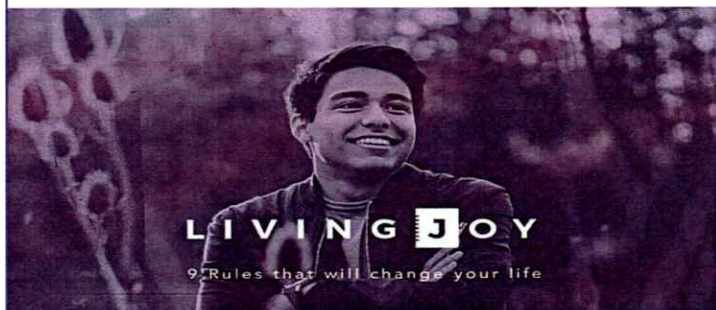

Musical Opportunities at St Joseph

St Joseph Catholic Parish has a long-standing tradition of being extremely musical. It is a very strong singing community as well as being committed to provide outstanding music.

If you enjoy music, perhaps there is a way that you could be more involved in the music program here at St. Joe's. Check out the following ways that provide you an opportunity to be more involved that might appeal to you and/or your schedule.

Adult Choir – Sings every weekend during the school year. 1st and 3rd and 5th Sunday at the 10:30 Mass and the 2nd and 4th Saturday at the 4 PM Mass. Rehearsal once a week typically. Thursday night from 6:30 – 8PM. No audition.

Youth Choir – Sings every 2nd Sunday during the school year at the 10:30 AM Youth Mass. Rehearsal is 1 hour before the Mass. No audition.

*** Family Pickup Choir** – We are just launching this. We are inviting families to sing together as a choir one time a month. Families, adults, children, teens interested would come at 9:30AM to a 45 minute rehearsal in the music room just before singing at the 10:30AM Mass on the 4th Sunday of the month. No audition.

*** Funeral Choir** – We are just in the process of launching this. This ministry requires very little commitment. Typically funerals cannot be planned very far ahead, so there is usually a short notice. This choir is a group of people who loves to sing and like the freedom of a more lenient commitment. The choir will meet several times in the beginning to learn the selections of music used for funerals. After that, once you sign up for the choir, you will be put on an email list. When a funeral comes in, you will be notified via email or a phone call of the date and time of the funeral. If you are available, plan to come 30 minutes before the funeral Mass starts so that the choir can warm up. If you are not available just delete the email. No need to notify anyone. No audition.

Instrumentalists – We ALWAYS welcome instrumentalists to participate at any of the Masses. The use of various instruments enhances the overall music at any given Mass or service. Audition required.

Cantor – This ministry requires a bit more of a commitment. This is for those people who sing well, are confident to stand in front of the Assembly (congregation) and lead the community in song. This person leads the singing at Mass including the proclamation of the Psalm (sung scripture) from the Ambo as well as other proclamations. Requires an audition.

Primary Cantor – If none of the above interest you or your schedule doesn't allow you time to be involved, remember; you as a "pew person" are the primary cantor at any liturgy. You, as a member of the Assembly, sing God's praises from the pew which encourages other to participate as well as strengthen the Assemblies song. No audition.

*** These are new musical endeavors in the parish.**

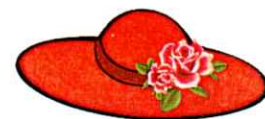

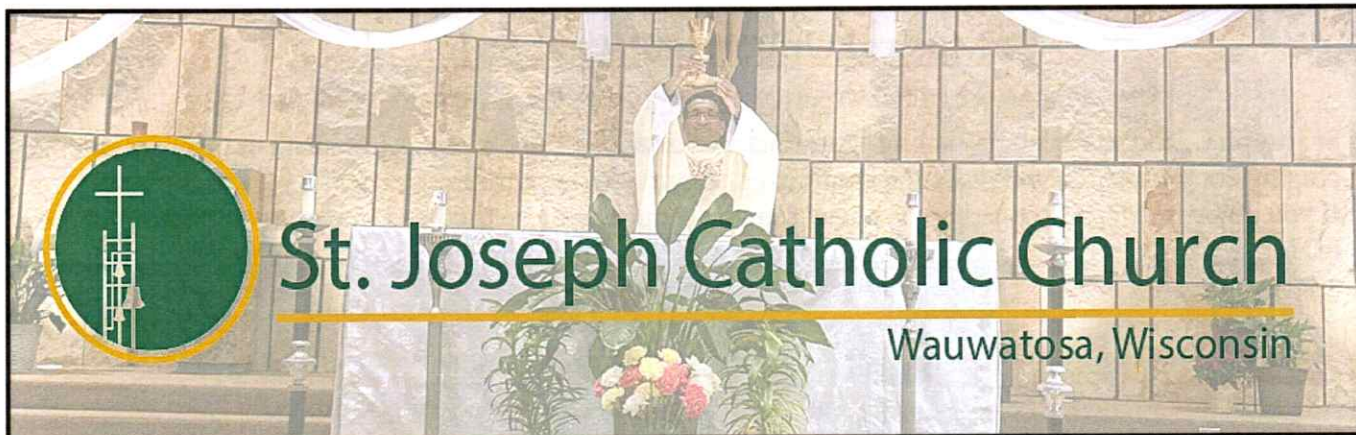
