HOLY WEEK AND THE SACRED TRIDUUM

Palm Sunday

Each celebration of the Eucharist on Palm Sunday weekend, March 23 and 24, will begin with the Solemn Procession with Palms as we commemorate Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. Weather permitting, the entire assembly will gather outdoors and process into church after the opening rites.

Masses on Palm Sunday weekend are Saturday at 5:00 pm (English) and 7:00 pm (Spanish); Sunday at 8:00 am, 10:00 am, 2:00 pm (Spanish) and 5:00 pm (English)

The Easter Triduum

The Easter Triduum is the high point of the year for Christians.

These three days—Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday—are days to save and to savor. On these three days, we gather a number of times with each other. Together we hear some of the church's most beautiful prayers and scriptures and we make some of our finest music. Please look closely at the parish schedule and make plans to take part in the various liturgies and other gatherings of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday.

The Paschal Fast

The Church keeps the paschal fast from Good Friday throughout the Easter Vigil. Unlike the penitential fasting of Lent, now over, it is a fasting even from the sacraments in joyful yearning for Easter.

In the midst of this fast, Holy Saturday is a day of quiet preparation. The Elect and Candidates gather in the morning for rites in anticipation of that night's Easter Vigil. Easter foods are blessed in the chapel on Holy Saturday at 1:00 pm

Christian Initiation

Resurrection joy finds its most perfect expression in the Easter sacraments. The Elect and Candidates celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation at the solemn Easter Vigil.

Throughout the fifty days of Easter, we will baptize infants in the midst of the Sunday assembly.

LENT AND THE EASTER TRIDUUM-2024

February – March 2024

Lent is an Anglo-Saxon word meaning spring. As nature (at least in the Northern Hemisphere) is awaiting rebirth, we too are called to an inner rebirth. The three disciplines of Lent—**prayer**, **fasting**, **and almsgiving**—are meant to call us to conversion that we might experience God's love more intimately.

Prayer invites us to take time to be still so that we can nurture our relationship with God and with ourselves. Prayer assures us that God is with us. Prayer changes us.

Fasting helps create a hunger for God and for what really matters in our lives. Fasting challenges us to trust that God will provide all that we need.

Almsgiving moves us to acknowledge how much we have been given and fills us with gratitude and praise. Almsgiving frees us from fear by compelling us to surrender what we have and who we are to others. Almsgiving changes us.

Ash Wednesday, February 14, is a day of fast and abstinence.

6:30 pm and 8:00 pm Masses in Spanish


PARISH LENTEN MISSION

A popular speaker and musician, Father Hepburn also served as director of the Office of Vocations from 2011-2018.




LENTEN PRAYER

ARCHDIOCESAN LENTEN REGULATIONS

Abstinence from meat is observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those bound by this rule may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted to maintain strength according to one's needs. The Fridays outside of Lent remain days of penance, but each individual may substitute the traditional abstinence from meat with some practice of voluntary self-denial or personal penance.

RECONCILIATION SERVICE

Our Lenten Reconciliation Service will be held on Tuesday, March 5, at 7:00 pm. At this time we will join our previously baptized candidates in celebrating a brief rite of Word, song and prayer as we together express our contrition and our hope to rise with Christ beyond sin and death. Please plan to celebrate this healing sacrament on this night when we will have the assistance of many neighboring priests for confessions. Please note that no confessions are scheduled during the Sacred Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday.

DAILY WORSHIP

At St. Thomas Aquinas we celebrate daily Mass, Monday-Friday at 12:00 noon. Every Thursday evening we celebrate a 7:00 pm Mass in Spanish.

RITE OF ELECTION

The Rite of Election celebrates God's call to our Catechumens to the waters of Baptism at Easter.

This year, the Rite of Election for our deanery will be held on Saturday, February 17 at St. Catherine of Siena Catholic Church at 10:00 am. There, Archbishop Hartmayer will declare the Catechumens the Elect of God. They will be declared ready to celebrate the sacraments of initiation at Easter.

The Book of the Elect, which includes the names of those who will be baptized at St. Thomas Aquinas this Easter, will remain near the baptismal font throughout Lent.

On the third, fourth and fifth Sundays of Lent, we will celebrate the Scrutinies with the Elect on Sundays at the 10:00 am Mass and the 2:00 pm Mass in Spanish.
