



Meeting Christ in Prayer BEGINS September 26 and 29!

Meeting Christ in Prayer introduces participants to various ways of praying, helps them form regular habits of prayer, and to experience support in the Christian life in a new way. It can also inspire a profound sense of mission that leads to a new level of discipleship. A small group setting led by St. Peter Ignatian Spirituality Team members, meets for 75 minutes weekly for 7 weeks. Sessions include guided meditation, an orientation to Scripture readings, sharing and reflection, prayer techniques, and an overview of the individual prayer exercises to be practiced in the week ahead.

Relief for Hurricane Ida victims

Hurricane Ida has wreaked havoc and brought heavy rains, flooding, and "catastrophic transmission damage" to Louisiana's electrical system, leaving the city of New Orleans and over a million people throughout the state without power. If you would like to help the victims, here are some ways:

Catholic Charities of Acadiana is on the ground supporting those in Ida's wake; donate to their efforts at <u>give.classy.org/disaster</u>. If you know someone in need of help in the impacted areas, they should text DISASTER to 797979 or fill out the form found here: https://www.disasterassistance.gov/get-assistance/forms.

World Central Kitchen, led by Chef José Andrés, tweeted that a team in New Orleans would activate its kitchen facilities in the city. He said they have supplies already on hand for more than 100,000 meals. Visit https://wck.org/news/hurricane-ida

Imagine Water Works has a <u>Hurricane Idea Relief Fund</u> that Jesuit partners in New Orleans recommend as a place-based, creative organization that centers folks with marginalized identities in conversations and action around a shared future living with water, working in an intersection of reducing risk from flooding, pollution, and natural hazards.

Help Haiti with Long Term Recovery

Magis Americas is organizing folks in the US to donate to an earthquake emergency fund, joining Jesuit international development and mission organizations worldwide in a global fundraising effort for both emergency relief and long-term recovery. This initiative will support the response of Jesuits and Jesuit organizations in Haiti- groups like Foi et Joie (Fe y Alegria school network in Haiti) and Service Jésuite aux Migrants who have long histories working in impacted areas and whose staff are Haitian Jesuits and lay colleagues.

Reflection



Do You See Jesus?

Do you see Jesus each time you are at Mass? Even better, do you experience Jesus Christ in the many ways that he is in our midst?

In the Gospel, Jesus tells us that "Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." (Matthew 18:20). Jesus Christ is with us. He is among us through grace. He is in us for we are the Body of Christ, as St. Paul reminds us in his letters. Look around you at Mass. Those you see are members of the Body of Christ. We need to recognize that each one is a member of Christ, rather than trying to judge them, and that all are needed if Jesus' work is to continue in the world. Do you see Christ in them and in yourself whenever they or you act in grace? We need to pray that we have Jesus' eyes and Jesus' heart whenever we gather together.

Do you hear Jesus speak to you in the Word of the Gospel and in the other Scriptures? Do we allow his Word to speak to our

minds and settle in our hearts? Do we take seriously the prayer that the Deacon or Priest prays as we prepare to listen to the Gospel? "Lord, be in my mind, on my lips, and in my heart that I might worthily proclaim the Holy Gospel." We all need to allow the Gospel to speak to our minds and our hearts, so that when we speak to others our words might be words of grace.

Do we recognize Christ Jesus in the Eucharist as we are joined in communion with Christ our Head and with our brothers and sisters in the Body of Christ? Jesus came to reconcile us to one another and to all, and it begins each time we pray the Our Father and each time we receive Communion.

Yes, each time we gather together in Christ for Mass, Jesus fulfills his words to us, "where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." Christ is more present than we often think.


