Dear Parishioners of the Shepherd of Souls AFC,

We have the shortest season of Advent possible this year. The Fourth Sunday of Advent is also Christmas Eve. In order to offer four Christmas Eve Masses, we will have a different Weekend Masses schedule for Dec. 23 and 24th. That schedule and the Christmas schedule are in this newsletter.

Advent is a gift to us to prepare ourselves to celebrate the great feast of Christmas, one of our most holy days of the Church year. During Advent we contemplate the Second Coming of Jesus at the end of time. What needs to change in our life to be ready? Christ comes to us each day and especially at Christmas. I encourage you to prepare for meeting Christ by celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The schedule for the two Sunday and four Wednesday evening communal penance services is also included. We offer the sacrament 45 minutes before the Saturday evening liturgies. Since Advent is only three weeks long, please make a plan to celebrate the sacrament that takes into consideration there may be snowstorm on Dec. 23rd.

Masses for the Holy Day of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary will be Dec. 7th and 8th.

In this time of the Eucharistic Revival, our AFC will be offering special "Encounter Nights" with Eucharistic Adoration and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Depending on the church, there may be some Worship and Praise music in addition to the silence. The first one will be Friday, Dec. 8th at St. John. There will be a Potluck meal from 6-7pm (BBQ provided please bring a side to share) followed by Adoration from 7-8pm. Please come and allow the Lord to encounter and change you.

Everyone is invited to the celebration of **Our Lady of Guadalupe on Sunday, Dec. 10**th at the Noon Mass in Spanish. The homily will also be in English. We are planning to have a Mariachi band again this year for Mass and to play during the Potluck meal to follow in the Social Hall.

The end of the year is not far away, and it is time to start thinking of strategies to maximize the tax benefits of year -end giving. Federal tax laws and many state laws make it possible to reduce or eliminate taxes on gifts to charities like your parish, diocese, schools and other ministries. Remember that only gifts made by December 31st can help reduce the amount of taxes you owe next April. Please consult your professional tax advisor for tax strategies for your personal situation.

The most popular way to give to charity is still by cash or check. Gifts completed by December 31st will qualify for tax deductibility for the current tax year. Gifts of cash qualify for up to one-half of your adjusted gross income (AGI). You will receive an acknowledgement for gifts of \$250 or more. If you are a registered member you will receive a statement in January indicating your 2023 giving.
