Designated Funds Continued:

Olson School Fund. This fund is designated to support the charitable purposes of the School of St. Philip and its ministries. The beginning balance in this fund for fiscal year 2022-2023 was \$41,220.41. The fund was increased by \$1,058.55 in interest and dividends as well as \$1,189.58 in unrealized market gains. The balance in this fund as of 6/30/23 was \$43,468.54.

<u>School Savings Fund</u> This fund is savings from prior years. The beginning balance for fiscal year 2022-2023 was \$45,936.90. We needed to use \$38,316.40 in 22/23 to balance the school budget. The balance in this fund as of 6/30/23 was \$7,620.00.

<u>School Education Center Fund</u> This fund is for the building needs of the School of St. Philip's. The beginning balance for fiscal year 2022-2023 was \$70,575.46. \$1,824.08 in interest was earned in 2022-2023 as well as unrealized market gains of \$4,130.82. The balance in this fund as of 6/30/23 was \$76,530.66.

School Scholarship Fund This fund is for scholarships for school tuition. The beginning balance for fiscal year 2022-2023 was \$31,806.76. \$1,200.00 was received from charitable gaming, \$9,527.03 was raised between donations and the Believe It! Achieve It! Scholarship Fundraiser. \$9,400.00 in scholarships were given to families. The balance in this fund as of 6/30/23 was \$33,133.79.

School Endowment Fund This fund is designated to support the charitable purposes of the School of St. Philip and its ministries. The Interest from this fund is used toward the operating budget (\$2,701.79 in 2022-2023). The beginning balance for fiscal year 2022-2023 was \$112,116.48. We had donations of \$8,500.00 added to the fund. Unrealized market gains of \$5,904.54 were incurred. The balance in this fund as of 6/30/23 was \$126,521.02.

School Designated Gifts Fund Donations are received for various designated purposes for school projects such as the computer lab and network upgrade. The beginning balance for fiscal year 2022-2023 was \$26,334.11. In 2022-2023 \$1,050.00 was received and \$4,208.15 was spent for various school projects. The balance in this fund as of 6/30/23 was \$23,175.96.

Diocesan Ministry Appeal

The Diocesan Ministries Appeal (DMA) is conducted annually in November by the Diocese of New Ulm. Each parish is asked to meet a goal. The Diocesan Ministry Appeal helps support the ministries of the Diocese of New Ulm by funding our Diocesan Catholic Charities Programs, Education of Future Priests and Permanent Deacons, Diocesan Lay Ministry Programs and Youth programs. In addition 20% of your contribution to the DMA is returned to the parish for a designated parish project. St. Philip's designated project for 2022 was for outdoor youth gathering area/patio area.

The DMA goal for 2022 was \$40,137.61. Currently the Diocese has received contributions of \$34,786.35. \$6,957.27 was returned to our parish to be used for outdoor youth gathering area/patio area. St. Philip's 2023 DMA goal is unknown at this time. The 2023 project will be the youth gathering area/patio area.

SHEPHERD OF SOULS CATHOLIC AREA FAITH COMMUNITY

The Church of St. Philip is a member of the Shepherd of Souls Catholic Area Faith Community. Organized by the Diocese of New Ulm, our Area Faith Community includes the Churches of St. Philip, St. John, and Our Lady. For fiscal year 2022-2023 the salaries and benefits of the priests and pastoral associate were

shared based on population. The Church of St. Philip's share was 55%, Church of St. John's 25%, the Church of Our Lady 20%. For the 2023–2024 fiscal year the shares will be StP 40%, StA 25%, StJ 20% and OL 15%.

Fr. Jeff Horejsi is the Pastor of all the parishes within the Area Faith Community and is assisted by Fr. Mike Doyle who servers as our Associate Pastor.

Designated Funds:

In addition to our regular operating revenues St. Philip's receives designated gifts from generous donors. These funds are listed and explained below.

General Parish Savings The balance in our parish savings from past years was \$458,155.92 at the end of 2022-2023.

<u>Building Fund</u> We have a monthly envelope for this fund. This fund is a reserve for future building and equipment needs, including major repairs and maintenance. The beginning balance of this fund for 2022-2023 was \$41,545.95. \$3,289.00 was added from the monthly Building Fund envelopes and interest and realized gains of \$814.70 were added. We used \$1,416.34 for roof repair. Unrealized market gains of \$1,628.16 were incurred as well. The balance in the fund as of 6/30/23 was \$45,861.47.

Emergency Assistance Fund St. Philip's has a monthly contribution envelope for our Emergency Assistance Fund. In addition the offering for Holy Thursday is added to this fund. Your donations are used for people who come to St. Philip's door seeking assistance for food, shelter and emergency needs. The balance to start the year was \$9,446.00. Contributions this year totaled \$987.00. \$4,126.12 was given out in emergency assistance in 2022-2023. That leaves a balance of \$6,306.88 as of 6/30/23.

Charitable Gaming Fund

St. Philip's conducts charitable gaming to assist with special projects for the parish and assist other charitable needs. The balance at the beginning of 2022-2023 was \$74,850.56 . \$7,700.00 was added from our charitable gaming activities. \$1,267.27 of dividends and interest were earned. We purchased a carpet cleaner for \$4,950.00 and \$6,332.70 was used for Staff Christmas . There was also \$1,890.29 in unrealized market gains. The balance was \$74,425.42 as of 6/30/23.

Bulletin Ad Revenues Fund This fund is savings for the need for new parish copiers and office equipment. It also covers the expense of printing and the paper needed for the bulletin and the website. The beginning balance for fiscal year 2022-2023 was \$50,943.03. In 2022-2023, \$8,645.00 was collected from businesses that advertise in our Parish Bulletin each week. In addition we earned \$1.092.08 of interest and dividends. We used \$9,757.10 of this fund last year for printing the bulletin, copier expenses and the website. Unrealized market gains of \$1,690.38 were also incurred. The balance of this fund as of 6/30/23 was \$52,613.39. We are grateful to our local businesses that help support the cost of printing and publishing our parish bulletin each week.

<u>Youth Fund</u> A youth fund has been established to help parish youth raise funds for mission trips and activities. The beginning balance for fiscal year 2022-2023 was \$11,616.51. Interest of \$198.90 was earned as well as unrealized market gains of \$285.04. \$1,960.00 was used for NCYC. The balance in this fund as of 6/30/23 was \$10,140.45.

Memorials Fund Often times parishioners and loved ones leave a gift to St. Philip's in their estate or out of gratitude to God and the parish. These gifts are placed in the memorial fund and are used as the donor requests or are designated for special uses by the pastor. The beginning balance for fiscal year 2022-2023 was \$848,584.84. \$632.00 was received in memorials. In addition \$25,681.97of interest was earned as well as unrealized market gains of \$9,106.26. \$1,304.39 was used for flowers for Christmas and Easter. The balance in this fund as of 6/30/23 was \$882,700.68.

Olson Endowment Church Fund The Clifford and Audrey Olson Endowment is designated to support the charitable purposes of the Church of St. Philip and its ministries. The beginning balance for fiscal year 2022-2023 was \$163,623.26. Market gains of \$14,304.05 were incurred and \$6,300.00 was returned to the parish as a grant per the spending policy and used for Faith Formation. The balance in this fund as of 6/30/23 was \$171,627.31.

Olson Endowment Church Grant Income Fund. This fund is designated to support the charitable purposes of the Church of St. Philip and its ministries. These funds are invested long term at Edward Jones. The beginning balance in this fund for fiscal year 2022-2023 was \$100,916.69. The fund was increased by \$2,409.64in interest and dividends as well as \$3,813.86 in unrealized market gains. The balance in this fund as of 6/30/23 was \$107,140.19.

<u>Prayer Shawl Ministry Fund</u> The prayer shawl ministry makes prayer shawls for a variety of parishioners; those homebound, hospitalized, suffering with illness. The shawls are a gift of our prayers of support and love. The beginning balance for fiscal year 2022-2023 was \$1,331.08. Donations of \$70.00 were received last year, while \$178.60 was used for materials to make the prayer shawls. The balance in this fund as of 6/30/23 was \$1,222.48.

<u>Funeral Donations Fund</u> CCW funds were transferred to the church when the CCW for St. Philip disbanded. This fund is for items needed for the kitchen. We receive donations from the funeral home for serving funeral meals. The beginning balance for fiscal year 2022-2023 was a \$12,243.05. Donations of \$1,797.20 were received, while we use \$534.88 for coffee carafes and silverware compartments. The balance in this fund as of 6/30/23 was \$13,505.37.
