In this survey, you will be asked for feedback in four key areas:

- Catholic Identity and Relationship with God
- Journeying Together as Faith Community

Please review all the questions and answer those that you feel called to answer. We are grateful for any feedback you provide. The feedback will be gathered, summarized, and ultimately sent on to Rome, where world Bishops will meet to discuss the issues in October 2023 at the Vatican.
