November 7, 2018, marks the 109th anniversary of the founding of the Knights of Peter, Inc. Our Noble Order and its over 17,000 members celebrate 109 years of faithfully providing Faith, Hope, and Love through Friendship, Unity, and Christian Charity across the United States.

When the Knights of Peter Claver and Ladies Auxiliary was founded in 1909 – just 46 years after the end of legal slavery – our seven founders, four Josephite priests and three laymen, stared down the barrels of social and economic injustices, systemic racism, and outright hatred for people of color and formed what would become the largest and oldest historically Black Catholic lay fraternity in the world.

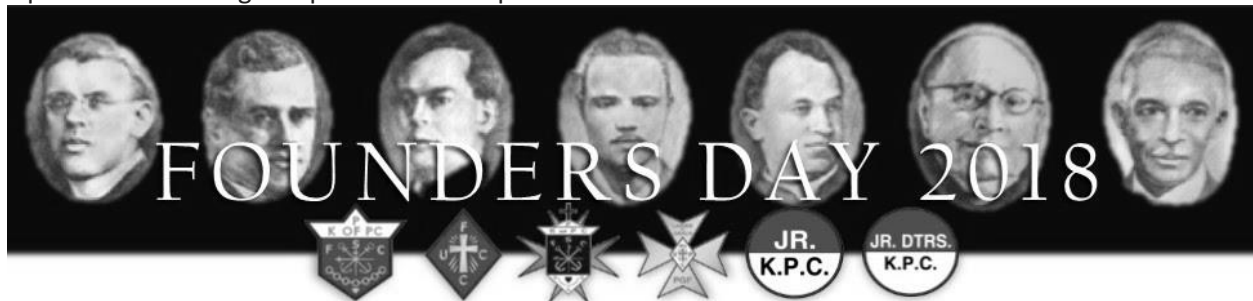
While you may be familiar with our service and work within the Church, we are actively engaged in many charitable, civic, and social efforts throughout the community. We strive to follow the example of selfless and endearing love and service administered by St. Peter Claver, our Patron Saint who ministered and gave care to African slaves arriving on the shores of Colombia, South America.

We support and assist with the work of education, community, and health organizations throughout the country - focusing on academic enrichment and tutoring; the eradication of poverty; sickle cell, breast cancer, and diabetes awareness, research, and support services; and many other worthy causes.
