RECONCILIATION (CONFESSION):

Saturdays 3:00 PM and by appointment.

BAPTISMS: To arrange and prepare for the celebration of Baptism, please call the Pastor to schedule an appointment. Baptisms are usually celebrated on Sunday afternoon.

FUNERAL: Please call the parish as soon as possible to make arrangements for the Mass of Christian Burial.

VISITING THE SICK: If you or a family member are sick or in the hospital, please call the parish so that a pastoral visit can be arranged. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick may be celebrated in the parish before hospitalization. Please call also to arrange for a Eucharistic minister to bring Communion to the sick. If you would like to request prayers for someone who is sick, please call the parish so that the name may be placed in the bulletin.

MARRIAGES: Preparation must begin at least six months prior to the wedding. Please make arrangements with the parish before scheduling the reception.

ANNULMENTS/CONVALIDATION: Please arrange a meeting with the Pastor to begin the process of celebrating your marriage in the Church. NEW PARISHIONERS: Catholics who would like to be registered as parishioners of Immaculate Conception and receive stewardship envelopes should call the parish secretary or fill out a form in the vestibule of the church.

RCIA: Adults who desire to explore the possibility of becoming a member of the Catholic Church should contact the RCIA (Rite for the Christian Initiation of Adults) team. Preparation usually begins in September and Baptism or Reception is celebrated at the next Easter Vigil.

TUITION ASSISTANCE: Some financial aid for tuition assistance to Catholic schools is available to registered members of the parish. This is a one time grant of no more than \$1,000.00 to needy families to assist them during a time of financial crisis. Eligible families should write a letter to the Pastor who will evaluate the request with the Financial Advisory Committee.

Palm Sunday is a Christian celebration that marks the beginning of the Holy Week leading to Easter Sunday. It commemorates Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem, when people laid down palms and branches in front of him as a sign of honor. In modern times, churches hold Palm Sunday services in which worshippers are given a palm branch or cross made from palm leaves. The celebration involves singing hymns, reading Scripture, and sometimes even a procession with the palms. Palm Sunday is a reminder of the selfless love Jesus showed by laying down his life for us, and it is a time to reflect on our own lives and how we can show that same love to those around us.



HOW TO PARTICPATE IN HOLY WEEK

Holy Week is the most solemn week of the year as we participate in the Paschal Mystery—the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of the Lord. Here are some ways in which you can make this week special.

- Participate in the Holy Week Services on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Vigil. The liturgies are dramatic; they help us enter into the final events of Christ's life. Make these days like a mini retreat.
- On *Holy Thursday*, bring a small bell or tambourine with you to church and ring it during the Glory to God. Plan to spend an hour after the Mass of the Lord's Supper in quiet prayer and adoration. Jesus said, "Could you not watch with me for one hour?" Gather a group of family and friends to pray with you.
- On *Good Friday*, read the Passion according to John before you come to church and reflect upon it. We will refrain from all conversations in the church before and after the service. If you need to have a conversation, have it outside. At the veneration of the cross, we will remove our shoes and approach the cross in stocking or bare feet.
- On Holy Saturday, be present to witness the Baptism, Confirmation, and First Communion of our catechumen.
 Teryn DeRouen. As we renew our Baptismal Promises, let it be a recommitment to be a disciple of Christ. Bring a
 small container to church with you, and after the service fill it with Baptismal Water, and bless your house with the
 water on Easter. Bring your bell again and ring it during the Glory to God.
- On Easter Sunday, let us welcome all our guests who come to worship on Resurrection Sunday. You never know
 what someone is going through. You never know what led them to come to church on Easter. Welcome them with
 the joy of the Risen Lord.


