## **Sacraments**

RECONCILIATION (CONFESSION):

Saturdays 3:00 PM and by appointment.

BAPTISMS: To arrange and prepare for the celebration of Baptism, please call the Pastor to schedule an appointment. Baptisms are usually celebrated on Sunday afternoon.

FUNERAL: Please call the parish as soon as possible to make

arrangements for the Mass of Christian Burial.

VISITING THE SICK: If you or a family member are sick or in the hospital, please call the parish so that a pastoral visit can be arranged. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick may be celebrated in the parish before hospitalization. Please call also to arrange for a Eucharistic minister to bring Communion to the sick. If you would like to request prayers for someone who is sick, please call **the** parish so that the name may be placed in the bulletin.

**MARRIAGES:** Preparation must begin at least six months prior to the wedding. **Please** make arrangements with the parish before scheduling the reception.

ANNULMENTS/CONVALIDATION: Please arrange a meeting with the Pastor to begin the process of celebrating your marriage in the Church.

NEW PARISHIONERS: Catholics who would like to be registered as parishioners of Immaculate Conception and receive stewardship envelopes should call the parish secretary or fill out a form in the vestibule of the church.

RCIA: Adults who desire to explore the possibility of becoming a member of the Catholic Church should contact the RCIA (Rite for the Christian Initiation of Adults) team. Preparation usually begins in September and Baptism or Reception is celebrated at the next Easter Vigil

TUITION ASSISTANCE: Some financial aid for tuition assistance to Catholic schools is available to registered members of the parish. This is a one time grant of no more than \$1,000.00 to needy families to assist them during a time of financial crisis. Eligible families should write a letter to the Pastor who will evaluate the request with the Financial Advisory Committee.


Father, your truth is made known in you Word. Guide us to seek the truth of the human person.



Robinson Sr. recounts his hardscrabble childhood in South Carolina, his education at Morehouse College and Howard University, his career as a professor and administrator in the Southern University system, and his activities as a community leader in Baton Rouge, LA. The first elected Black member of the East Baton Rouge Parish School Board, Robinson consistently fought to level the playing fields for Back Americans and to better the social and physical environment of his adopted city.

#### REMEMBERING KATRINA TWENTY YEARS LATER BY FATHER CLARK

As Katrina was approaching the Mississippi-Louisiana border in late August 2005, I had some free time after my parish in Boston was merged into a new Black Catholic parish. Seeing the destruction brought about by the flooding, I volunteered with the Red Cross and was placed as a chaplain in a shelter in Orange, Texas where folks who had been evacuated from the Superdome were housed. In an old school building, we did the best we could to help people cope through the crisis. Two memories stand out for me. When the school year began, children in the shelter attended local schools. I remember watching the school busses drive away with some children aboard for whom this was the first day of school ever. What a way to begin your academic career! How resilient they were! Like little troopers boarding those busses! The second memory was the evening when Red Cross volunteers from New Orleans cooked a real homecooked South Louisiana dinner. There was such joy that evening to have a little taste of home. From there I went to Shreveport where I was chaplain for the Holy Family Sisters who had evacuated there. While there, my Provincial asked me to visit Immaculate Conception in Baton Rouge with the possibility of becoming pastor. The rest is history!
