


# FEAST OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION



# GOOD NEWS ABOUT CHURCH RENOVATION





# **ADVENT: A TIME OF EXPECTANT HOPE**

**W**aiting is a central theme during the Advent season. Mary's waiting in expectant joy and hope can guide us in our own waiting during Advent. Advent Week One: Waiting in expectant hope as Mary did, not only opens our hearts to welcome the Word made flesh at Christmas, it also allows us to recognize Emmanuel– God with us in our midst. An essential part of a grace-filled Advent is allowing God to come to us in the midst of our everyday experience. Are we able to wait and welcome God into our midst as Mary did? May we, like Mary, learn to wait in expectant hope for the coming of Jesus, our Savior, whose continued presence gives us reason to always live in hope.



#### Sacraments

#### **RECONCILIATION (CONFESSION):**

Saturdays 3:00 PM and by appointment.

**BAPTISMS:** To arrange and prepare for the celebration of Baptism, please call the Pastor to schedule an appointment. Baptisms are usually celebrated on Sunday afternoon.

**FUNERAL:** Please call the parish as soon as possible to make arrangements for the Mass of Christian Burial.

VISITING THE SICK: If you or a family member are sick or in the hospital, please call the parish so that a pastoral visit can be arranged. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick may be celebrated in the parish before hospitalization. Please call also to arrange for a Eucharistic minister to bring Communion to the sick. If you would like to request prayers for someone who is sick, please call the parish so that the name may be placed in the bulletin.

MARRIAGES: Preparation must begin at least six months prior to the wedding. <u>Please</u> make arrangements with the parish before scheduling the reception.

ANNULMENTS/CONVALIDATION: Please arrange a meeting with the Pastor to begin the process of celebrating your

marriage in the Church.

**NEW PARISHIONERS:** Catholics who would like to be registered as parishioners of Immaculate Conception and receive stewardship envelopes should call the parish secretary or fill out a form in the vestibule of the church.

RCIA: Adults who desire to explore the possibility of becoming a member of the Catholic Church should contact the RCIA (Rite for the Christian Initiation of Adults) team. Preparation usually begins in September and Baptism or Reception is celebrated at the next Easter Vigil.

TUITION ASSISTANCE: Some financial aid for tuition assistance to Catholic schools is available to registered members of the parish. This is a one time grant of no more than \$1,000.00 to needy families to assist them during a time of financial crisis. Eligible families should write a letter to the Pastor who will evaluate the request with the Financial Advisory
