

REFLECTIONS FROM FATHER CLARK

BIBLE STUDY THE CHRISTMAS GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MATTHEW (The Gospel for December 21)

Matthew 1: 18-25

- ♦ Matthew tells the story of Jesus' birth through the eyes of Joseph.
- ♦ Joseph is a good man. Although the Law says that Mary should be stoned to death because it appears that she has been unfaithful to Joseph, he decides to divorce her quietly to save her from the death penalty.
- ♦ Joseph has a dream. Another Joseph, the son of Jacob, also had dreams that got him into trouble with his brothers but saved him from Pharaoh's prison. Joseph is in the line of the ancestors to whom God communicated through dreams. A dream in the Bible is a metaphor for a religious experience in which God communicates with a human being.
- ♦ In the dream, an angel tells him not to be afraid to take Mary as his wife because she is with child by the Holy Spirit. The angel gives the child the name Jesus, which means Savior. The angel's announcement fulfills the prophecy of Isaiah 7: 14. The child will be Emmanuel which means "God is with us." The Gospel of Matthew will end with Jesus' promise to be with us always until the end of time. He truly is Emmanuel.


