

REFLECTIONS FROM FATHER CLARK

KWANZAA

Kwanzaa is rooted in the history and culture of the African diaspora. During the social and political upheaval of the 1960s the holiday helped Americans of African descent reconnect to their African cultural heritage. Kwanzaa is celebrated for seven days, and each day celebrates one of seven core principles.

December 26 – Umoja (Unity)
December 27 - Kujichagulia (Self-Determination)
December 28 – Ujima (Collective Work and Responsibility)
December 29 – Ujamaa (Cooperative Economics)
December 30 – Nia (Purpose)
December 31 – Kuumba (Creativity)
January 1 – Imani (Faith)

Setting the table during Kwanzaa is an important tradition that many African descendants who celebrate the holiday follow. The seven symbols of Kwanzaa that appear on the table are ears of corn; gifts; a straw mat; a cup that symbolizes unity; a candleholder; vegetables, fruits, and nuts; and seven candles that represent the holiday's seven key principles. Three candles are green, three are red, and one is black; the black candle stands for African people, the red candle stands for the struggles they have endured, and the green candle stands for the future and land (via History).

Kwanzaa provides the opportunity to be reflective during the week between Christmas and New Year. Kwanzaa is not a substitute for Christmas by any means. It is an enhancement of the holy season that reclaims the African heritage for those whose culture and history were robbed because of slavery. Which principle speaks the most to you? Reflect on how you can incorporate it in your New Year goals. *Habari gani!* (What's happening?) Kwanzaa!


