
RENOVATION UPDATE: MASS IN ACTIVITY CENTER NEXT WEEKEND

Mark E. Dean was born in Jefferson City, Tennessee on March 2, 195 and computer engineer. Dean holds a bachelor's degree in electrical engi Tennessee, a master's degree in electrical engineering from Florida Atlantic trical engineering from Stanford University. He is the first African-America which is the highest level of technical excellence at the company. In 1997, tional Inventors Hall of Fame.

Currently, he is the interim dean of the Tickle College of Engineering guished Professor in the Department of Electrical Engineering and Comput Tennessee. He was previously CTO for IBM Middle East and Africa and wa seeing the company's Almaden Research Center in San Jose, California more than 20 patents. RECONCILIATION (CONFESSION):

Saturdays 3:00 PM and by appointment.

BAPTISMS: To arrange and prepare for the celebration of Baptism, please call the Pastor to schedule an appointment. Baptisms are usually celebrated on Sunday afternoon.

FUNERAL: Please call the parish as soon as possible to make arrangements for the Mass of Christian Burial.

VISITING THE SICK: If you or a family member are sick or in the hospital, please call the parish so that a pastoral visit can be arranged. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick may be celebrated in the parish before hospitalization. Please call also to arrange for a Eucharistic minister to bring Communion to the sick. If you would like to request prayers for someone who is sick, please call the parish so that the name may be placed in the bulletin.

MARRIAGES: Preparation must begin at least six months prior to the wedding. Please make arrangements with the parish before scheduling the reception.

ANNULMENTS/ČONVALIDATION: Please arrange a meeting with the Pastor to begin the process of celebrating your marriage in the Church.

NEW PARISHIONERS: Catholics who would like to be registered as parishioners of Immaculate Conception and receive stewardship envelopes should call the parish secretary or fill out a form in the vestibule of the church.

RCIA: Adults who desire to explore the possibility of mine. Amen. becoming a member of the Catholic Church should contact the RCIA (Rite for the Christian Initiation of Adults) team. Preparation usually begins in September and Baptism or Reception is celebrated at the next Easter Vigil.

TUITION ASSISTANCE: Some financial aid for tuition assistance to Catholic schools is available to registered members of the parish. This is a one time grant of no more than \$1,000.00 to needy families to assist them during a time of financial crisis. Eligible families should write a letter to the Pastor who will evaluate the request with the Financial Advisory
