RECONCILIATION (CONFESSION): Saturdays 3:00 PM and by appointment.

BAPTISMS: To arrange and prepare for the celebration of Baptism, please call the Pastor to schedule an appointment. Baptisms are usually

celebrated on Sunday afternoon. **FUNERAL:** Please call the parish as soon as possible to make arrangements for the Mass of Christian Burial.

VISITING THE SICK: If you or a family member are sick or in the hospital, please call the parish so that a pastoral visit can be arranged. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick may be celebrated in the parish before hospitalization. Please call also to arrange for a Eucharistic minister to bring Communion to the sick. If you would like to request prayers for someone who is sick, please call **the** parish so that the name may be placed in the bulletin.

MARRIAGES: Preparation must begin at least six months prior to the wedding. <u>Please</u> make arrangements with the parish before scheduling the reception.

ANNULMENTS/CONVALIDATION: Please arrange a meeting with the Pastor to begin the process of celebrating your marriage in the Church. **NEW PARISHIONERS:** Catholics who would like to be registered as parishioners of Immaculate Conception and receive stewardship envelopes should call the parish secretary or fill out a form in the vestibule of the church.

RCIA: Adults who desire to explore the possibility of becoming a member of the Catholic Church should contact the RCIA (Rite for the Christian Initiation of Adults) team. Preparation usually begins in September and Baptism or Reception is celebrated at the next Easter Vigil.

TUITION ASSISTANCE: Some financial aid for tuition assistance to Catholic schools is available to registered members of the parish. This is a one time grant of no more than \$1,000.00 to needy families to assist them during a time of financial crisis. Eligible families should write a letter to the Pastor who will evaluate the request with the Financial Advisory Committee.

The Good Samaritan

FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME JULY 13, 2025

He answered, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind; and, 'Love your neighbor as yourself." "You have answered correctly," Jesus replied. "Do this and you will live." Luke 10: 27-28

In Jesus' day Jews and Samaritans were enemies to the point that they would not associate with one another. The priest and Levite avoided the half-dead man in order to maintain their ritual purity. According to the Jewish law, by touching the man they would have become unclean and had to wait for a period of time before being able to worship in the Temple again. Thus, they "passed by on the opposite side." They were more concerned with themselves than with the dying man. The Samaritan, on the other hand, pushed aside his own needs to care for this man. He loved the stranger who was his enemy and was willing to do whatever it would take to save him. We are invited and challenged by Jesus to emulate this radical love and mercy. We can look to the Good Samaritan as a model and, then, "Go and do likewise." So I ask myself, what are those things that get in the way of loving the stranger (perhaps concern about how much time it will take, or fear, a grudge, or belief that I do not have the strength to help)? I ask God to give me the grace to overcome all obstacles that get in the way of me helping my neighbor.
