**Sacraments RECONCILIATION (CONFESSION):** 

Saturdays 3:00 PM and by appointment.

BAPTISMS: To arrange and prepare for the celebration of Baptism, please call the Pastor to schedule an appointment. Baptisms are usually celebrated on Sunday afternoon.

FUNERAL: Please call the parish as soon as possible to make arrangements for the Mass of Christian Burial.

VISITING THE SICK: If you or a family member are sick or in the hospital, please call the parish so that a pastoral visit can be arranged. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick may be celebrated in the parish before hospitalization. Please call also to arrange for a Eucharistic minister to bring Communion to the sick. If you would like to request prayers for someone who is sick, please call the parish so that the name may be placed in the bulletin.

MARRIAGES: Preparation must begin at least six months prior to the wedding. Please make arrangements with the parish before scheduling the reception.

ANNULMENTS/CONVALIDATION: Please arrange a meeting with the Pastor to begin the process of celebrating your marriage in the Church. NEW PARISHIONERS: Catholics who would like to be registered as parishioners of Immaculate Conception and receive stewardship envelopes should call the parish secretary or fill out a form in the vestibule of the church.

RCIA: Adults who desire to explore the possibility of becoming a member of the Catholic Church should contact the RCIA (Rite for the Christian Initiation of Adults) team. Preparation usually begins in September and Baptism or Reception is celebrated at the next Easter Vigil.

TUITION ASSISTANCE: Some financial aid for tuition assistance to Catholic schools is available to registered members of the parish. This is a one time grant of no more than \$1,000.00 to needy families to assist them during a time of financial crisis. Eligible families should write a letter to the Pastor who will evaluate the request with the Financial Advisory Committee.

Martha, burdened with much serving, came to him and said, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me." The Lord said to her in reply, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Luke 10:40-42

Today's gospel can seem confusing. Martha takes care of all the tasks involved with serving Jesus, their guest, while Mary simply sits beside Jesus listening to him speak. And yet when Martha points out that Mary is not helping, Jesus seems to say Martha 'Stop worrying. Mary is doing the right thing'. How frustrating that must have been for Martha who welcomed Jesus in to her home and worked so hard to make sure everything was prepared for him. I think we can all relate to Martha's plea. And the truth is that preparing for and serving guests is an essential part of hosting any visitor. However, imagine being a visitor and seeing your host so frantically worried about the details that they forget the reason for your visit, which is simply to spend time together. Jesus reminds us that the focus in serving is simply giving attention to the person in front of us. May we ask God to grant the grace to remain present to the people He puts in front of us this week.
