
FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT






God didn't promise days without PAIN, laughter without SORROW, nor sun without RAIN.

Sacraments

RECONCILIATION (CONFESSION):

Saturdays 3:00 PM and by appointment.

BAPTISMS: To arrange and prepare for the celebration of Baptism, please call the Pastor to schedule an appointment. Baptisms are usually celebrated on Sunday afternoon.

FUNERAL: Please call the parish as soon as possible to make arrangements for the Mass of Christian Burial.

VISITING THE SICK: If you or a family member are sick or in the hospital, please call the parish so that a pastoral visit can be arranged. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick may be celebrated in the parish before hospitalization. Please call also to arrange for a Eucharistic minister to bring Communion to the sick. If you would like to request prayers for someone who is sick, please call **the** parish so that the name may be placed in the bulletin.

MARRIAGES: Preparation must begin at least six months prior to the wedding. <u>Please</u> make arrangements with the parish before scheduling the recention.

ANNULMENTS/CONVALIDATION: Please arrange a meeting with the Pastor to begin the process of celebrating your marriage in the Church. NEW PARISHIONERS: Catholics who would like to be registered as parishioners of Immaculate Conception and receive stewardship envelopes should call the parish secretary or fill out a form in the vestibule of the church.

RCIA: Adults who desire to explore the possibility of becoming a member of the Catholic Church should contact the RCIA (Rite for the Christian Initiation of Adults) team. Preparation usually begins in September and Baptism or Reception is celebrated at the next Easter Vigil.

TUITION ASSISTANCE: Some financial aid for tuition assistance to Catholic schools is available to registered members of the parish. This is a one time grant of no more than \$1,000.00 to needy families to assist them during a time of financial crisis. Eligible families should write a letter to the Pastor who will evaluate the request with the Financial Advisory Committee.

"I came into this world for judgment, so that those who do not see might see, and those who do see might become blind" John 9:39

In today's Gospel, the healing of the man born blind invites us to focus on the physical and spiritual aspects of sight and light. In the first part of today's Gospel, we hear Jesus' response to a prevalent belief of his time: that misfortune and disability were the result of sin. That belief is why Jesus is asked the question of whose sin caused the man's blindness—his own or his parents'. Jesus does not answer directly, but instead gives the question an entirely different dimension—through this man's disability, God's power will be made manifest. Jesus then heals the man.

The Fourth Sunday of Lent is Laetare Sunday. Laetare is a Latin word that means rejoice. We rejoice because we are at the half way point of Lent and we are very near to celebrating the feasts of the the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus at Holy Week and on Resurrection Sunday. Laetare Sunday is marked by the pink or rose-colored vestments. At the 4:00 PM Vigil Mass we will pray the

second Scrutiny for our catechumen, Teryn DeRouen. This afternoon, we will celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at 4:00 PM.

CELEBRATING HOLY WEEK



Holy Week (April 2-9) will be fast upon us. Please make plans to participate in the Holy Week services as much as your schedule allows. It can be like a miniretreat in which we prayerfully walk with Jesus in his final hours on earth. On Holy Thursday, we participate in the Last Supper as we wash feet and receive the Body and Blood of the Lord. We keep watch with him in the Garden of Geth-WORSHIP SCHEDULE semane as the church is open until 10:00 PM for Adoration. On Good Friday, we

stand at the foot of the Cross as we celebrate the Liturgy of the Passion and Death of the Lord at 3:00 PM. We hear the passion according to John, we pray for the needs of the whole world, we venerate the Cross, and receive the Body of the Lord in the Eucharist consecrated the night before. At the Easter Vigil, we light the new fire, listen to the stories of our salvation, celebrate the Baptism and Confirmation of Teryn DeRouen, renew our own Baptismal promises, and celebrate the first Eucharist of Easter. Let us celebrate the Paschal Mystery together!




