

THIS WEEK IN BLACK HISTORY

Father Cyprian Davis, spiritual writer/historian



Davis was born with the name Clarence John in Washington, D.C. on September 9, 1930. He converted to Catholicism in his teenage years and became interested in joining the priesthood as well as becoming a monk. Though many monastic communities did not accept African Americans at the time, after high school, Davis joined the seminary of St. Meinrad Archabbey (1949–1956). He became a novice on July 31, 1950, took the monastic name Cyprian on August 1, 1951, and was ordained a priest on May 3, 1956. He became the first African American to join the monastic community of St. Meinrad.

Davis received a S.T.L. from the Catholic University of America (1957), before going to the Catholic University of Louvain, Belgium to study church history, obtaining a licentiate (1963) and a doctorate (1977). Upon his first return from Belgium in 1963, he taught church history at St. Meinrad, and eventually became the school's first professor emeritus in 2012.

Davis returned to the United States in the midst of the civil rights movement. He attended the August 1963 March on Washington and heard Martin Luther King Jr. deliver his "I Have a Dream" speech. As a black Catholic professor, he began to be invited to speak in black parishes and was constantly asked about the place of African Americans in the Catholic church.

He was involved in writing two pastoral letters on race, "Brothers and Sisters to Us" (1979) and "What We Have Seen and Heard" (1984), and later received a grant from the Lilly Endowment to study the black church, resulting in the publication of his award-winning *"The History of Black Catholics in the United States"* (1990). Davis died on May 18, 2015 in Memorial Hospital in Jasper, Indiana, at age 84.

Sacraments

RECONCILIATION (CONFESSION):

Saturdays 3:00 PM and by appointment.

BAPTISMS: To arrange and prepare for the celebration of Baptism, please call the Pastor to schedule an appointment. Baptisms are usually celebrated on Sunday afternoon.

FUNERAL: Please call the parish as soon as possible to make arrangements for the Mass of Christian Burial.

VISITING THE SICK: If you or a family member are sick or in the hospital, please call the parish so that a pastoral visit can be arranged. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick may be celebrated in the parish before hospitalization. Please call also to arrange for a Eucharistic minister to bring Communion to the sick. If you would like to request prayers for someone who is sick, please call the parish so that the name may be placed in the bulletin.

MARRIAGES: Preparation must begin at least six months prior to the wedding. **Please** make arrangements with the parish before scheduling the reception.

ANNULMENTS/CONVALIDATION: Please arrange a meeting with the Pastor to begin the process of celebrating your marriage in the Church.

NEW PARISHIONERS: Catholics who would like to be registered as parishioners of Immaculate Conception and receive stewardship envelopes should call the parish secretary or fill out a form in the vestibule of the church.

RCIA: Adults who desire to explore the possibility of becoming a member of the Catholic Church should contact the RCIA (Rite for the Christian Initiation of Adults) team. Preparation usually begins in September and Baptism or Reception is celebrated at the next Easter Vigil.

TUITION ASSISTANCE: Some financial aid for tuition assistance to Catholic schools is available to registered members of the parish. This is a one time grant of no more than \$1,000.00 to needy families to assist them during a time of financial crisis. Eligible families should write a letter to the Pastor who will evaluate the request with the Financial Advisory

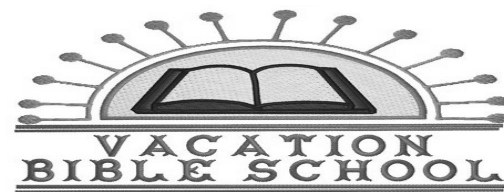
Announcements and Upcoming Events

WALKING WARRIORS HEALTH AND WELLNESS MINISTRY

 **HEALTHY TIDBIT:** Most researchers consider stuttering to be a neurological condition which has a genetic component. It usually starts between the ages of 2½- 5; affects about 3 million people in the US; and boys are about three times more likely to stutter than girls. Do not tell a person who stutters to "slow down," "take a breath," or "relax." Stuttering can pose a life-long challenge, but, speech therapy and self-help/support groups can improve a stutterer's communication. Maintain eye contact, listen carefully, and wait patiently until the person is finished speaking. A few famous persons who stutter: James Earl Jones, actor; Joseph "Joe" Biden, 2020 Democratic Presidential candidate; Ed Sheeran, singer/songwriter; Darren Sproles, running back, Philadelphia Eagles; Emily Blunt, actress. westutter.org
