

TRINITY SUNDAY



The first two Sundays of our return to Ordinary Time after the Easter Season are celebrations of the Blessed Trinity (May 29-30) and the Body and Blood of Christ (June 5-6). This weekend we celebrate Trinity Sunday. The mystery of the Trinity is at the heart of our faith. We express our belief in one God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We firmly believe that God is ONE but we also THREE IN ONE believe that God's unity is expressed in the diversity of three persons as Creator, Redeemer and Sanctifier. This is a mystery—not in the sense that we need to figure it out, but rather that we are in awe and wonder at how great God is and how God is so far beyond anything that our human mind and conceive or fully understand. Take this Trinity Sunday to be amazed at how great God is!
