THIS WEEK IN BLACK HISTORY

Howard Thurman



Theologian, minister, author, and activist **Howard Thurman** was best known as an influence and early mentor of some of the civil right movement's most notable figures. The Daytona Beach, Fla. native was born November 18, 1899.

The Morehouse man graduated as class valedictorian in 1923, and two years later became an ordained Baptist minister in 1925 while still studying at the Rochester Theological Seminary, graduating there in 1926. His first prominent role as part of an academic faculty came

when he was named the dean of Rankin Chapel at Howard University.

Thurman left the tenured position at Howard in 1944 to joined Dr. Alfred Fisk in establishing the Church for the Fellowship of All Peoples in San Francisco, the first major interracial, non-denominational church in the United States. The church was among the many early churches that allowed members of all spiritual and racial backgrounds to worship as one.

In 1953, Thurman returned to the college ranks, joining Boston University and serving as the dean of Marsh Chapel, making him the first Black Dean to lead a chapel at a predominately white university. He retired from the post in 1965, focusing more on lecturing and writing up until his passing.

Thurman's 1945 book, "Jesus and the Disinherited," influenced Rev. King's philosophy, and was a book partly inspired by Gandhi's approach and response to oppression via acts of radical nonviolence. Thurman met with Gandhi at various early points of his career, and the book introduced the concept of nonviolence to many in the burgeoning civil rights movement. Thurman also established an educational trust in 1965 after retiring from Boston. Thurman passed in 1981.

RECONCILIATION (CONFESSION):

Saturdays 3:00 PM and by appointment.

BAPTISMS: To arrange and prepare for the celebration of Baptism, please call the Pastor to schedule an appointment. Baptisms are usually celebrated on Sunday afternoon.

FUNERAL: Please call the parish as soon as possible to make arrangements for the Mass of Christian Burial.

VISITING THE SICK: If you or a family member are sick or in the hospital, please call the parish so that a pastoral visit can be arranged. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick may be celebrated in the parish before hospitalization. Please call also to arrange for a Eucharistic minister to bring Communion to the sick. If you would like to request prayers for someone who is sick, please call the parish so that the name may be placed in the bulletin.

MARRIAGES: Preparation must begin at least six months prior to the wedding. <u>Please</u> make arrangements with the parish before scheduling the recention.

ANNULMENTS/CONVALIDATION: Please arrange a meeting with the Pastor to begin the process of celebrating your marriage in the Church. **NEW PARISHIONERS:** Catholics who would like to be registered as parishioners of Immaculate Conception and receive stewardship envelopes should call the parish secretary or fill out a form in the vestibule of the church.

RCIA: Adults who desire to explore the possibility of becoming a member of the Catholic Church should contact the RCIA (Rite for the Christian Initiation of Adults) team. Preparation usually begins in September and Baptism or Reception is celebrated at the next Easter Vigil.

TUITION ASSISTANCE: Some financial aid for tuition assistance to Catholic schools is available to registered members of the parish. This is a one time grant of no more than \$1,000.00 to needy families to assist them during a time of financial crisis. Eligible families should write a letter to the Pastor who will evaluate the request with the Financial Advisory Committee.

MAY 7, 2023




