REFLECTIONS FROM FATHER CLARK

The holidays are fast upon us! This week we celebrate Thanksgiving. I encourage everyone to make it a priority this week to be mindful of all for which you are grateful. We take so much for granted. Let us take an inventory of our lives this week and name the things for which we are grateful. Take nothing for granted, even the most ordinary of things. When you are conscious of your gifts, then you become more conscious of the Giver of All Good Gifts.

Next Sunday begins a new church year and the season of Advent. We will begin to read the Gospel of Matthew for most Sundays in the coming year. We are a Lectionary Church, meaning that the readings for each Sunday are chosen for us. Whereas, in other Christian churches the pastor chooses the theme of his message and then supports it with Scripture. We start with the Scripture and then apply it to our lives. This coming year is Cycle A of the Lectionary.

We all complain about how commercial Christmas has become and how it does not feel the same way it used to. We can do something about that! Take time out before Christmas to celebrate Advent. Advent is the four weeks before Christmas. The theme of Advent is preparation and waiting. Build in some time to be quiet and still in December. Put off your celebrations of Christmas until after December 17. If you start now, you will be sick of Christmas by December 25. Do some special things to prepare to receive Jesus in your heart and home. Some ways to make Advent meaningful:

- Read a chapter of Luke's Gospel starting on December 1. There are twenty-four chapters in the Gospel, so you will finish on December 24 and know whose birthday you are celebrating on Christmas!
- Make an Advent wreath. All you need is four candles. Light an additional one each week and sit quietly in the light of the candles.
- Each day of Advent, set aside time each day when you turn off your phone, and other electronics and entertainment, and sit quietly in the Lord's presence. You will be amazed at how good the silence feels.

On Saturday, December 6, we will have a morning of reflection for the parents and children of the Parish School of Religion. Father Clark asks all families to make this a priority. The morning retreat will replace the Sunday classes during December. It is important that families attend together. We want to make our PSR more family oriented. Instead of the classroom model, we want to involve the whole family in learning about their faith. This is our first attempt. Families, please make it a priority to attend.


