THIS WEEK IN BLACK HISTORY

Philip Downing/Inventor



Before 1891, folks who wanted to send a letter would have to visit their local post office to do so. **Philip Downing** invented a metal mailbox that is the predecessor for the modern version of the ones we use today.

Downing was born March 22, 1857 in Providence, R.I., although some have written that he hailed from Ontario, Canada. His father, George, was a successful businessman and abolitionist, and his grandfather, Thomas, set the tone for the family in similar fashion.

The first of Downing's inventions, the "New and Useful Improvements in Street Railway Switches," approved in June 1890, allowed train operators to switch on and off power and proper times from the train cabin.

On October 27, 1891, Downing's patent for the "Street Letter Box" made it possible for residents to leave their mail inside a tall metal box for the postman to pick up and take to their home post office. The Street Letter Box was fashioned with a self-closing hinge door that kept mail safe from the elements and potential thievery.

In 1917, Downing was issued a patent for a handheld envelope moistener, and the following year, he invented a new type of desktop notepad. Downing eventually settled in Boston after living across New England and in Washington, D.C. He passed on June 7, 1934 at 77.

Sacraments

RECONCILIATION (CONFESSION):

Saturdays 3:00 PM and by appointment.

BAPTISMS: To arrange and prepare for the celebration of Baptism, please call the Pastor to schedule an appointment. Baptisms are usually celebrated on Sunday afternoon.

FUNERAL: Please call the parish as soon as possible to make arrangements for the Mass of Christian Burial.

VISITING THE SICK: If you or a family member are sick or in the hospital, please call the parish so that a pastoral visit can be arranged. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick may be celebrated in the parish before hospitalization. Please call also to arrange for a Eucharistic minister to bring Communion to the sick. If you would like to request prayers for someone who is sick, please call the parish so that the name may be placed in the bulletin.

MARRIAGES: Preparation must begin at least six months prior to the wedding. <u>Please</u> make arrangements with the parish before scheduling the reception.

ANNULMENTS/CONVALIDATION: Please arrange a meeting with the Pastor to begin the process of celebrating your marriage in the Church. NEW PARISHIONERS: Catholics who would like to be registered as parishioners of Immaculate Conception and receive stewardship envelopes should call the parish secretary or fill out a form in the vestibule of the church.

RCIA: Adults who desire to explore the possibility of becoming a member of the Catholic Church should contact the RCIA (Rite for the Christian Initiation of Adults) team. Preparation usually begins in September and Baptism or Reception is celebrated at the next Easter Viail.

TUITION ASSISTANCE: Some financial aid for tuition assistance to Catholic schools is available to registered members of the parish. This is a one time grant of no more than \$1,000.00 to needy families to assist them during a time of financial crisis. Eligible families should write a letter to the Pastor who will evaluate the request with the Financial Advisory Committee.



But it is easier to appear pious or to instruct others regarding their faults than to implement God's commands in our own lives.


