Patron Saint of the Week: Blessed Father Solanus Casey: Class 5A

(1870-1957, United States)

Born in Wisconsin, Blessed Solanus Casey began to study for the priesthood when he was 21 years old. He became a Capuchin friar, and was known as "The Doorkeeper" because of the 20 years he served as porter at Saint Bonaventure Monastery in Detroit, Michigan. He was always ready to meet people and listen to their needs at any hour of the day or night.

He treated each visitor, whether rich or poor, as he would have treated Christ.

Blessed Solanus Casey, you treated each visitor at your monastery as you would have treated Jesus. Help us to be thoughtful of others, to be gracious, gentle, and kind.
