Ash Wednesday is Wednesday, March 6. Students are expected to attend Mass with their families at regular class times of 5:00 and 6:45pm as their PSR assignment for the

week. There will be no reserved seats and Mass will begin promptly at 5:00 and 7:00 pm. The school building will be closed.

Participation in the Sunday celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of our Catholic faith. The obligation to participate in the Mass each week is not merely a duty, but a compelling reminder of how deeply the Eucharist shapes our identity. The parish community gathers to celebrate in liturgy what it is in life: the Body of Christ. The Eucharist, like all sacraments, is three-dimensional. At Mass, we celebrate the memorial of Christ's Passion, recalling all of salvation history. We celebrate Christ's presence with us in the here and now under the form of the sacred Bread and Wine. And we look to a future beyond all imagination - the heavenly banquet we will celebrate in the fullness of God's kingdom.

#### What are you doing for Lent this year? Maybe:

- 1. Take the kids grocery shopping for the poor and bring the food back to PSR for the food pantry.
- 2. Let the children light a candle at church for people who are suffering.
- 3. Turn off the television, video games, etc. and spend quality time together.
- 4. Read the lives of the saints to your children.
- 5. Begin breakfast with the prayer "Lord we offer you this day, and all we think and do and say."
- 6. At dinnertime let each family member mention one person or problem that they would like to pray for.
- 7 Say an Our Father together every day.
- 8. Attend Mass together.
