



### ANCHORED IN HOPE THROUGH STUDIOUSNESS

#### Seeking Knowledge to Grow Closer to Truth

I don't have a very good phone. The screen is too small for my aging eyes, and it's also cracked so that makes it even more difficult to read. The phone is an older model so it is fairly slow to load things. I'm actually okay with all of that because it keeps me from spending a lot of time reading people's Tweets, searching for a new Pin, or commenting on posts. It can be very tempting to devote hours of our days to doing those things and to justify it by convincing ourselves that we are gaining knowledge. We are probably not. Instead, we are probably just gaining information, and even if the information we are acquiring may not be bad or evil, too much information can fill our minds and keep us from gaining knowledge. Information is different from knowledge. For Catholics, knowledge is the ability to judge all things according to the truths of our faith. What that means for us is that everything we learn should serve the purpose of somehow drawing us closer to God, who is truth. That is what the virtue of studiousness will help us to do--seek knowledge to grow closer to truth.

As parents, you have given your children a wonderful gift in sending them to a Catholic school. Catholic schools relate all learning to God. Whether the students are learning about world communities in social studies, the universe in science, the orderliness of numbers in math, the beauty of the written word in language arts, or the importance of keeping their bodies healthy in physical education classes, your children are learning the truths of our faith and practicing studiousness here at St. Patrick in all their classes.

No matter how many classes they take at school though, the home is where your children are learning their most important lessons, and you, as their parents, are their most important teachers. You can help your children practice the virtue of studiousness by limiting the amount of unnecessary information they are exposed to or are tempted by everyday. Put time limits on their phones, TV's, and gaming systems so that they will have more time open for exploring the world and the truths it holds. When they are using their devices, make sure you know what they are reading, watching, and hearing so that you can have conversations about the information they get, relate it to truths, and help them to turn that information into knowledge. Spending more time seek truth as a family will bring you closer to each other and closer to God. What a wonderful way to build the virtue of studiousness!

- ♣ The teachers will bring their classes out to the Pet Blessing area.
- ♣ Students with pets to be blessed may go to their parent(s) and pet.
- ♣ Students without pets to be blessed will remain with their teacher in designated areas
- ♣ Father Fischer will begin with prayer and then walk around the circle to bless each pet with holy water.
- After the blessing, students will return to their classrooms to prepare for dismissal.

# TRUNK OR TREAT

### GUIDELINES

If you plan to participate with your vehicle at the Trunk or Treat, please read the following:

- 1. **You must have REGISTERED to participate!** Please put your registration flyer on your dashboard when you are entering into the lot.
- 2. **Parking lot opens at 6:30 pm** to allow time to set up your trunks. Pay close attention to the parking lot attendants. They will be directing traffic to ensure all spaces are filled. Please DO NOT skip spaces. If everyone shows up that registered, we will use ALL parking spaces plus some. We will have cars line up similar to school carpool and will park cars similar to church parking.
- 3. **Open up and decorate your trunk** or the back of your vehicle. There are some great trunk decorating ideas on the internet. Please refrain from anything overly spooky or gory. Possibilities could include a Halloween theme, sports, comic characters, Biblical, exotic locations, a particular decade- and can be as elaborate or simple as you wish. If lights are needed, please make sure they're battery powered, as electricity will not be available on-site.
- 4. **Parking lot will close at 7:00**. At that time no one will be allowed into the parking lot to ensure the safety of everyone involved and the children will be allowed to start trick or treating.
- 5. **The parking lot will reopen at 9:00 when it is safe for cars to begin leaving.** No one will be allowed to leave early! At that time everyone must be in their cars and you will be dismissed in an orderly fashion similar to school carpool.
- 6. Approximately **250 children** are participating, so remember to bring lots of candy to pass out. Don't forget your trick or treat bags!
- 7. For **candy**, please only bring store-bought, individually-wrapped treats. Small trinkets would be acceptable in place of candy.
- 8. Everyone helping at Trunk or Treat is encouraged to wear a family-friendly costume.

- 11. **Have fun and BE SAFE!** Bring some lawn chairs to sit in and hand out candy to the kids! Compliment costumes! Meet a family! Have a great time!


