Requirements

All Confirmation candidates are required to fulfill 10 Christian Living *ACTIVITIES* per year. These activities may be divided up as follows:

- * Minimum 4 Holy Encounters.
- * Minimum 4 Christian Service Credits.
- * Two additional ACTIVITIES from either category

MANDITORY SERVICE CREDITS:

- * Each candidate must work one Knights of Columbus 'Fish Fry' during Lent.
- * Three Service Credits of your choice.

MANDITORY HOLY ENCOUNTER:

- * Each candidate must attend one 'Adoration' during Advent.
- * Each candidate must attend one 'Stations of the Cross' during Lent.
- * Two Holy Encounters of your choice.

Each activity/project/event requires the completion of a reflection page enclosed in the Christian Living Journal. Many opportunities of both Holy Encounters and Christian Service will be presented to you in class. However, this list is not all inclusive. Please consider any opportunities that come up to serve others. If you are unsure of an activity qualifying for credit, please ask one of your catechists or see Tom.

It's good to have you participating and preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation! As Roman Catholics, so much of how we celebrate our faith is experiential. We are a Sacramental Church, and the Sacraments allow us to come into contact with the Divine and receive grace. Fully initiated Roman Catholics are expected to witness their faith in a lived way through:

- * The Mass
- * The Sacraments
- * Prayer and Catholic Devotions
- * Christian Service

On this last leg of your Christian Initiation, you are called to move into a life of active Christian living. You must be prepared go in peace to love and serve the Lord, and continue that active living the rest of your life.

Year I and Year II Christian Living Requirements

10 Total Christian Living Experiences per year.

A minimum of 4 of these *ACTIVITIES* <u>must</u> be spent in Christian Service (Service Credit). 1 Service credit must be working the Knights of Columbus Fish Fry.

A minimum of 4 of these *ACTIVITES* <u>must</u> be spent in Holy Encounters (Holy Encounters Credit). 1 Holy encounter must be attending Adoration during Advent and 1 must be attending Stations of the Cross during Lent.

An additional 2 may come from either category.

All hours must be accompanied by a reflection sheet upon completion (see attached).

HOLY ENCOUNTERS

Beginning now, you can prepare for a Holy Encounter, experience it, and reflect on it by answering a simple set of questions.

- 1. Choose from one of these common encounters to experience:
 - * A Catholic Baptism (1st Sundays at 11 a.m. here at St. Ann, unless it is a holiday weekend.)
 - * A Catholic Wedding in a Catholic Church
 - * A Catholic Anointing of the Sick
 - * A Catholic First Holy Communion
 - * Catholic Confirmation (outside of R.E.)
 - * The Sacrament of Reconciliation (outside of R.E.)
 - * A Catholic Funeral in a Catholic Church
 - * Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament
 - * A communal recitation of the Rosary
- 2. Prepare for your Holy Encounter by pre reading the list of provided questions. This will give you some things to prepare to experience.
- 3. Answer a short list of questions about your Holy Encounter, and be prepared to discuss it at your Confirmation interview.

If you have a hard time attending one of the above events, call the R.E. Office, or ask your catechist and we can give you some more ideas.
