Requirements

All Confirmation candidates are required to fulfill 10 Christian Living *A CTIVITIES* per year. These activities may be divided up as follows:

- ⇒ Minimum 4 Holy Encounters.
- ⇒ Minimum 4 Christian Service Credits.
- ⇒ Two additional A CTIVITIES from either category
- ⇒ Service Credits and Holy Encounters are your choice with the exception of the following mandatory ones listed below.

MANDITORY SERVICE CREDITS:

- Each candidate must attend one Saturday church housekeeping from 8am until 10am.
- Each candidate must work one Knights of Columbus 'Fish Fry'.

MANDITORY HOLY ENCOUNTER:

- Each candidate must attend one 'Adoration' during Advent.
- Each candidate must attend one 'Stations of the Cross' during Lent.

Each activity/project/event requires the completion of a reflection page enclosed in the Christian Living Journal. Many opportunities of both Holy Encounters and Christian Service will be presented to you in class. However, this list is not all inclusive. Please consider any opportunities that come up to serve others. If you are unsure of an activity qualifying for credit, please ask one of your catechists or see Tom.
