One of the places is the Pregnancy Resource Center, Birthright, which offers love, support, and friendship to women going through hard times such as this. Birthright, as advertised on their website, is: "free, non-judgemental, and confidential, and is located right in Manchester, on 247 South Main Street. Other places, such as "Option Line" have 24-hour contact centers, and their top priority is to "reach, rescue and renew women who are abortion-vulnerable".

The Year of Mercy just ended, so I would not want to pass judgement on her, but I can explain to her that all human life is sacred and that as Pope St. John Paul II says, "the direct killing of an innocent human being is always gravely immoral.." If my friend was still not certain, I would also offer Adoption resources, which at least offer the baby a chance at life.
