Celebrating Notes

THANK YOU! We are nearly 2 months into resuming public worship, and I continue to be thankful for all who are working so hard and faithfully to make certain we can gather as safely as possible during these times: our **Parish Staff**, our **Julian Ministers**, our **Sanitization Teams**, our **Liturgical Ministers**, and **you**, parishioners, who have acted responsibly and been supportive of **how** we are called to come together during these times. As this Pandemic continues, I know we are all getting a little weary of many things, including the protocols, but they are necessary at this time and important that we realize all we do is out of care, concern and in charity for one another.

In that light, I wanted to take this time to remind us all that, as we enter the main body of the Church and/or the Alcove area, please, allow the **Julian Minister** to direct you to the available pew for seating, **and** be certain to move to a place in the pew that is the furthest from the **center aisle** (keeping in mind the protocol for physical distancing). This will avoid: 1) additional worshippers having to step over or in front of another to take their place safely in the pew, if space is available, and 2) allow us to seat more people given our limited capacity. I realize that everyone, prior to the middle of March, had (and still long for) their "favorite seat", but these days call for accommodations to be made.

Also, you are reminded that **entrance** into the pew is by means of the **center aisle** (in the main body of the Church; the **western side aisle** (in the Alcove area of the Church) (opposite, only when returning from Communion). **Exiting** from the pew (during Mass or once Mass has concluded) is by means of the **side aisles** (in the main body of the Church); the **eastern side aisle** (in the Alcove area of the Church). If, during Mass, you need to leave your pew, if there are others between you and the side aisle, they are asked to step up; step out; step back, so you can safely exit, and do the same when you return (by means of the proper aisle).

Thank you all for your continued cooperation at this time. **PEACE! Fr. Mike LOL!! (Lean on the Lord!!)**

NEXT WEEKEND, August 1-2, IS OUR ANNUAL MISSION APPEAL. Due to the different times we are in, there will not be a speaker or representative for the **“Foundation for Children in Need” (FCN)**. The FCN is a Catholic lay organization based in Arlington Heights, IL, with extensive mission work in the interior villages of India. FCN sponsors 2500 children and college students. They have been responsible for building several schools, boarding homes, a community health center, and two homes for the elderly, and provide free medical check-ups and medicine to thousands of needy people and children. 800 children born with Cleft Lip and Cleft Palate have been helped with free corrective surgeries in the past 5 years.
