Nationally:

Catholics across the country are encouraged to observe a nationwide prayer vigil from Thursday, Jan. 28 to Friday, Jan. 29, marking the 48th anniversary of the U.S. Supreme Court's 1973 [Roe v. Wade](#) and [Doe v. Bolton](#) decisions legalizing abortion through nine months of pregnancy. Since those decisions, more than 60 million abortions have been performed legally in the United States.

The vigil will begin with a live broadcast at 8 p.m. Jan. 28 from the ***Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception*** in Washington, D.C. with a rosary, followed by Mass opening the National Prayer Vigil for Life. The principal celebrant and homilist for the opening Mass will be Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann of Kansas City in Kansas, who is chairman of the USCCB Committee on Pro-Life Activities. After the Mass and throughout the night, holy hours led by bishops from various dioceses around the country will be broadcast on the USCCB's website. The vigil concludes at 8 a.m. Jan. 29 with Mass celebrated by Archbishop William E. Lori of Baltimore.

The live television broadcasts 8-11 p.m. Jan. 28 and 8-9 a.m. Jan. 29 will be provided by the Eternal Word Television Network and will also be available via livestream on the Basilica's website, <https://www.nationalshrine.org/>.
