#### A Note from Fr. Mark

We have come to the end of another fiscal year as well as to an end of an era. We have completed paying off our debt. Thanks go to many of you who not only fulfilled your pledge of "Fulfilling the Promise" but continued to maintain your regular contribution to our regular weekly collection. We are asking that, if possible, you continue your giving so that we might built up an "emergency fund" in case there comes a time with an unexpected expense. We are already putting money aside for such a purpose. As you may have heard, we have signed a contract with T&J Restoration to tuck-point and seal the bricks of the Church and rectory. And the good news is that we have the money on hand to fulfill this contract. Another change will be coming in September when the new



parish, St. Vincent de Paul, will be inaugurated by Bishop McKnight with a special Mass at the Heckart Performing Arts Center. And finally, another change is that the leadership of the Catholic Church in Pettis County will now be under the leadership of two diocesan priests who come with tremendous backgrounds in parish and diocesan leadership. Many of our priests, brothers, and candidates have grown by being in relationship with you and sharing both faith and life in your midst. There is still much work to be done both in the parish and in helping Sacred Heart School continue to be a beacon of excellence in education.

As we celebrate the ending of our debt, we are looking ahead acknowledging that there are some other needs within our Church that will need attention in the near future. As outlined in the state of the parish budget, we ended our 2018-2019 school year in a deficit, and forecast to be in a similar situation for the upcoming school year. An extraordinary gift from our Sacred Heart School Foundation provided some debt relief, however operating in this fashion is not sustainable, nor prosperous for the next generation of students.

We are in a pivotal time for our school; however, we are putting our faith and trust in God and in all of us working together to implement our Strategic Growth Plan. A comprehensive SGP update will be featured in the August bulletin. In the meantime, some immediate ways you can join us in our efforts include:

- Inviting and encourage family and friends with school-age children to call us for a school tour or experience student life through a shadow day. Sacred Heart School offers a faith-filled, quality education like no other.
- Investing in our Foundation Annual Fund Drive Appeal is a significant way to help families who cannot pay the full cost to educate their child(ren). We'll be reaching out to parishioners with our Annual Fund Drive in September.
