

# The Nativity of the Most Holy Mother of God, the Theotokos and Ever-Virgin Mary


#### **Background**

The birth and early life of the Virgin Mary is not recorded in the Gospels or other books of the New Testament, however this information can be found in a work dating from the second century known as the Book of James or Protevangelion.

According to the story found in this book, Mary's parents, Joachim and Anna, were childless for many years. They remained faithful to God, but their prayers for a child were unanswered. One day, when Joachim came to the temple to make an offering, he was turned away by the High Priest who chastised him for his lack of children. To hide his shame, Joachim retreated to the hill country to live among the shepherds and their flocks.

As Joachim was praying, his

wife Anna was praying at the same time their at house in Jerusalem. An angel appeared to both of them and announced that Anna would have child whose n a m e would be known throughout the world. Anna promised to offer her



child as a gift to the Lord. Joachim returned home, and in due time Anna bore a daughter, Mary.

#### **Icon of the Feast**

The icon of the Nativity of the Thetokos presents to us the central figures of Saints Joachim and Anna, Mary's parents. Anna is surrounded by attendants who have assisted with the birth.

The icon directs attention to Mary the central figure this feast. It also ack n o w 1 edges the joy that was felt by Joachim and Anna new as

parents with a child received through a promise from God. The liturgical texts of the feast acknowledge this joy and confirm the special role of Mary as the Mother of the Incarnate God, Jesus Christ. In this event, another step is made in sacred history in preparation for the entrance of Christ into the

world.

The icon and the feast also acknowledge a transition from barrenness to life. This was but another foreshadowing of what would be offered through Christ, the transformation from death to eternal.

2. Now is the time to drop off your Raffle donations from the "Contribution letter" to businesses and bottles of "Wine and Spirits" or any new items.

3. All Parishioner, friends and neighbors: You were all notified the week of April 29, 2018 (5 months ago) the Rummage Sale would be held September 21, 22, & 23,2018. Those who are ABLE you could still come a few hours a week. We are open in the morning at 10:00 a.m. and 2 days a week, open until 7:00 p.m. and open on Saturday. This "fundraiser" is for your church and helps in paying the bills. We need the men of the parish to help with the furniture that is set up in Father's Nestor garage and eventually moved to the driveway the week of September 17, 2018

Volunteers, Men, woman and teen-ages are needed on the 21 and 22 and 23rd during the sale: no experience needed: hand out boxes, give help to the customers, security at the doors, helping wrap and bags the items as they are sold, selling raffle tickets, selling jewelry, etc., now is the time to get yourself down to the school gym and help this
