COLORADO PARISH CHURCH VANDALIZED WITH PRO-ABORTION GRAFFITI

A Catholic parish in Boulder, Colorado, with a memorial to aborted babies on its front lawn was desecrated with pro-abortion graffiti in the early hours of Sept. 29.

Sacred Heart of Mary Parish was tagged with numerous spray-painted slogans including "Jesus [Loves] Abortion," "Bans off our bodies," "No Wire Hangers Ever," and a symbol combining an "A" signifying "anarchy" and the traditional symbol for "female."

Mark Evevard, Youth Director and Social Communications Director for the parish, told CNA that the police believe it was a group of unidentified assailants who hit the church, and that police are currently investigating.

The parish had a display of 4,000 small white crosses in its front lawn, each one representing a baby aborted each day in the United States. The vandals trampled and desecrated at least half of the crosses.

They also painted over signs

facing the roadway advertising the memorial, and covered the lenses of the lights that shine on the church building with red paint.

"My Body My Choice" was scrawled in bright red spray paint on a white pickup truck outside the church, and at least one of the truck's tires appears to have been deflated.

The vandals also used a rock or hammer to attempt to break the church's stained glass windows, but only managed to break the safety glass on the outside. They also threw eggs at several doors.

Although the church had a functioning security camera system, the images captured of the assailants are little more than "shadows," Evevard said, and have not proven helpful. The assailants purposely avoided being captured on video in an identifiable way, he said.

Evevard said the pastor, Fr. Jonathan Dellinger, has been encouraging parishioners to "put those folks at the

top of your prayer list, and pray for their conversion." Evevard said several passersby, including a few people not affiliated with the parish, have stopped to express condolences and help to clean up some of the mess.

St. Louis Parish in nearby Louisville was vandalized with similar proabortion graffiti recently, Evevard noted.

Boulder is home to one of the country's most prolific late-term abortionists, Warren Hern, who runs the Boulder Abortion Clinic, one of a handful of clinics in the U.S. that publicly accept patients seeking late-term abortions from anywhere in the world. Colorado remains one of only a handful of states that does not have some legislation on late-term abortion. As a result, abortions can take place in the state up until birth.

Life's Choices

Native Americans have a legend about the two paths one can take in life. One path is broad and easy and slopes down rolling hills. At the bottom of the hill, however, is a barren dessert where nothing lives. The other path is narrow and rocky. It winds around dangerous curves and is filled with unexpected difficulties. However, at the end of this path is the lush greenness of life and happiness.

The Native Americans told this story to their children in order to teach them that the easy way is not always the best way. Strong character is built by facing obstacles, not by avoiding them. In the same way, Christians grow in virtue and grace often through facing trials and struggles.

The life of the holy martyr Charitina

is witness to this lesson. She was a young orphan girl – of great beauty – who was raised by devout Christian parents.
