- Sometimes I feel like am at a concert with the liturgy stuck in. Priest should dictate the Mass, not the music. Music should not be the focal point. (As an example, the piano player receives the Eucharist along with the Deacon so they can get back to playing music.)
- Music is the best!
- Most homilies are helpful. Guest homilies by rieligious are relevant and interesting. Relate the Bible readings to current life.

Homilies should be like Goldocks----NOT TOO LONG not too short. just right. How do you act in traffic? in the parking lot? in family car trips? at work? at sports events? with your spouse? with your chidren/parents? in church? in an airplane/train/subway/bus?

- Sunday mass is enhanced when there is a good homilly. Only one person delivers a homily were the folks can realate their lives to. The readings are forever being interperted as historic events and Jesus;s goodnes. Homiley' should relate to the gosple message and then to todays events of how we can be a better society. Political, without naming parties, how we can improve the hate that surrounds the world today. Not water into wine.
- Music in liturgies is vibrant but homilies, not always. The Children's liturgy is kid friendly but not the regular Mass. Homilies are inconsistent in helping me understand scripture and growing my faith.
- The mass should be more connected to real life and real experiences.
- I am inspired by Fr. Daniel; I am not inspired by Fr. Joe... he is an academic level beyond relating to me.
- I appreciate the Spirit-filled homilies. I would benefit from additional time for reflection and prayer after receiving Communion.
- The music keeps me engaged in the mass as a participant. Most homilies' help me to further understand the Word and are very important to me. The only recommendation I have is to go back to the 0845 mass vice 0815 and if that is a burden on our clergy, which I believe it to be, decrease masses on Sunday to two vice three.
- Homilies are too focused on praising the congregation
- Over the last year or so, the focus of our church has not seemed to be on celebration of Mass....it has been on everything else going on and the Mass is just a place to announce things, share the vision instead of simply focusing on the Mass itself. Announcements at the beginning are important and helpful to know what all is going on the upcoming week at our Parish, but the "second talk" ....what sometimes ends up sounding like a second homily from a parishioner at the end of Mass has seemed to over shadow what we just experienced. Once we have celebrated the Eucharist, that should be our only focus, the high point of the Mass.

- I have always actively participated in the Liturgy and miss the connection that comes from participating in the Mass. I sometimes find it difficult to remain engaged during the homily due to the language barrier.
- The music, songs, and singing at Ascension are the best! When I'm traveling and attend Mass elsewhere, I realize how blessed and spoiled I am by Diane Nestor and her talented team!
- My measure of the effectiveness of a liturgy is how joyful I feel upon leaving. I almost always feel joy upon leaving Ascension. Thank you.

- We have great liturgies however, I think we should not rest on our laurels. We should investigate how we can make them even better.
- As a parent with young children, I find myself avoiding mass if I know it will be lengthy. I avoid certain pastors because I know their homilies are very long and repetitive. If I were single, this would not be an issue. However, Ascension services tend to be over an hour long...and it is just so stressful with little kids. I try my best, but I am a human being...we are human beings....and sometimes, the message gets lost when mass drags on and on. The teacher in me just frustrated by our leaders lack of understanding of the average attention span.
- Priets and certain Deacons add most value to the liturgies and homilies.
  Disappointed that Nuns and Sisters are not included in the comments and prayers during Sunday Masses.
- We have been singing the same "Glory to God" every Sunday since I joined the parish. It has become very mundane. It would be nice to change to another ""Glory" to keep us awake and engaged. The lights should be flipped several times to get talkers attention b4 Mass. Also the greeting neighbors b4 Mass breaks my prayer set.
- I would like to see more contemporary Christian music. We need to be able to engage and keep the youth and younger adults. We seem to be going backwards.
- I do not believe our parish communications is integrated enough, and I believe the announcements, sermon, and other weekend communications are well integrated.
- I prefer a bit more tradional Mass, but what Ascension offers is good.
- Sometimes the music is a bit... much. I enjoy a rousing chorus and clapping occasionally, but a sense of reverence is also appreciated.
