





Backsliding



Vaccines Protect Against Pneumonia and Flu



As you get older, you become more at risk for certain diseases. Pneumonia, an infection of the lungs that can cause mild to severe illness and even lead to hospitalization or death, spreads from saliva of an infected person. However, many people, especially children, can have the bacteria without being sick.

The best way to prevent pneumonia is by getting vaccinated. Pneumococcal vaccines help protect against many types of pneumococcal bacteria, which can also cause ear infections and meningitis. Talk to your doctor to see if you need these shots.

Avoid the flu “bug”! Another important vaccine is the flu shot. The flu shot protects against influenza, a contagious respiratory illness that can cause mild to severe illness.

Easy As Pie !!!

Perfect Pumpkin Pie

Ingredients

3/4 cup sugar 1 - 15 oz. can pumpkin
 1/2 tsp. salt 2 eggs, beaten
 1 1/2 tsps. pumpkin pie spice
 1 1/4 cups evaporated milk or half and half
 1 frozen pie crust

Directions

Heat oven to 425 degrees. In a large bowl, mix filling ingredients. Pour into pie crust. Bake 15 minutes. Reduce oven temperature to 350 degrees and bake 40-50 minutes. Longer or until knife inserted near center comes out clean. Cool in refrigerator before serving

Amazing Apple Pie

Ingredients

Refrigerated pie crusts 2 tbs. Flour
 6 apples thinly sliced 1/4 tsp. salt
 1 tsp. ground cinnamon 1/8 tsp. nutmeg
 1 tbs. Lemon juice 1 cup sugar

Directions

Heat oven to 425 degrees. Place one pie crust in 9-inch glass pie plate. Press firmly against side and bottom. Mix filling ingredients ; spoon into plate. Top with second crust, cut slits in top and seal edges. Bake 40-50 minutes. Or until apples are tender and crust is golden brown. Cool before serving.

Cheatin' Chicken Pot Pie

Ingredients

Refrigerated pie crusts (softened as on box)
 2 cups cooked cubed chicken
 1 jar chicken gravy
 2 cups frozen mixed vegetables

Directions

Heat oven to 400 degrees. Soften pie crusts as directed on package and place one crust in bottom and up sides of one-quart saucepan. Combine all filling ingredients in a medium saucepan; bring to boil over medium heat, stirring frequently. Pour into pan. Top with second crust; cut holes in top and seal edges. Bake at 400 degrees for 20-30 minutes or until crust is golden brown.

Peanut Butter Pie

Ingredients

4 ounces cream cheese, softened
 1 cup powdered sugar
 1/3 cup peanut butter
 1/2 cup milk
 1/2 tsp. salt
 8 ounces frozen whipped topping, thawed
 Prepared chocolate cookie crumb crust
 Chocolate syrup

Directions

Beat cream cheese, sugar, salt, peanut butter and milk until smooth then fold in whipped topping. Spread evenly in crust and top with syrup swirls. Refrigerate before serving.
