

COVID-19 ANNOUNCEMENT For St. Marianne Cope Parish

On Monday, November 9th, St. Marianne Cope Parish learned that an individual who attended the 4:30 p.m. Mass on Saturday, November 7th, tested positive for COVID-19. The person was asymptomatic at the time of Mass, is not hospitalized but is now showing symptoms of the virus and is isolated at home. The individual was wearing a mask and practiced social distancing. We are grateful that the individual immediately notified the parish office of the test results. We have been in contact with the Monroe County Public Health Department and the New York State Department of Health in this matter and were instructed today, November 9th, to share this information with our parishioners.

St. Marianne Cope Parish remains absolutely committed to following the precautions put in place in accord with federal, state and local protocols to ensure safety:

- All who enter the Church must wear a mask the entire time they are in the building;
- Hands must be sanitized when each person enters the Church;
- A distance of six feet is maintained between parishioners, unless they are of the same household;
- Access to the Church is maintained through specifically identified doors;
- The Church is completely sanitized after each Mass.

St. Marianne Cope staff, and your fellow parishioners, thank you for your full cooperation with these procedures. Be assured that the staff will continue to monitor the Coronavirus pandemic in our community, as well as continue to follow the necessary procedures for health and safety. We will keep you informed of any changes or developments as needed.
